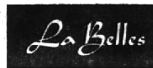

Scout Post Receives Charter

Twelve high school boys began a new era of scouting recently when they became official members of the first industrial explorer post to be chartered in the Detroit Area Boy Scout Council.

The post—number 1040—sponsored by the Ford Tractor and Implement Division in Birmingham, is one of a number of industrial posts being established around the country to give high school boys the chance to explore career opportunities in business while participating in a program of scouting.

Post 1040's charter was presented recently in a ceremony at the division's general offices which formally inducted the boys and adult leaders of the post into scouting. Merritt D. Hill, 965 E. Glengary Circle, Bloomfield Township, Ford vice president and divisional general manager, accepted the charter in behalf of the sponsoring organization. Hill is also president of the Detroit Area Boy Scout Council.

THE POST MEETS every second Wednesday at the division's offices at 2500 E. Maple. The year's program, planned by the boys, includes discussions with persons in different occupations concerning career opportunities in their field. Trips to industrial plants, camping, and social activities are also a part of the planned program.

A highlight of several of the meetings will be the tearing down and rebuilding of automotive and tractor engines to familiarize the boys with design and operational principles.

Three industrial explorer posts have been organized in the Detroit area to date. Representatives of these posts are Thomas Pinson, Oak Park, advisor of Post 1040; C. F. Adams, 6139 Dakota Circle, Bloomfield Township, executive vice president of MacManus, John and Adams and institutional representative of Post 1035, sponsored by M&A; and K. W. Thompson, Ferndale, assistant general plant manager, Michigan Bell Telephone Co., and a committeeman for Post 1680 sponsored by Michigan Bell.

Gare Addresses Traffic Officers From 3 Counties

A modern law enforcement officer must be a "combination of lawyer, judge, father confessor and have the patient of Job," Birmingham City Manager L. R. Gare said at police "commencement exercises" recently.

Gare was speaker at the final luncheon for 25 officers from Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties who received certificates for successful completion of an in-service traffic law enforcement course, presented by Michigan State University.

Final instructor in the course was Birmingham Police Chief Ralph W. Moxley is training chairman for the Michigan Association of Chiefs of Police. The MACP is one of the sponsors of such training programs.

In his luncheon talk, Gare stressed that police officers have more contacts with the public than all other city employees combined, and that most of these contacts are in traffic enforcement.

"SERVICE is the only commodity a municipality has to sell and so a whole government may be judged by its policemen," he said.

Two area patrolmen presented certificates were James Cochran, Birmingham, and Henry Juntunen, Bloomfield Hills.

MSU's school of police administration and continuing education services jointly conducted the course with the highway traffic safety center. One scholarship for each participating department was provided through an annual grant from the Automobile Club of Michigan.

The five-day course was spread over a three-week period.

Burglars Net \$10,000 In AAA Checks, Cash

The Federal Bureau of Investigation is assisting Birmingham police in their investigation of a \$10,000 burglary of the Birmingham branch of the Automobile Club of Michigan.

According to police the burglars broke into the AAA office at 275 S. Hunter between 9 p.m. last Thursday and 8 a.m. Friday and made off with \$2,270 in American Express Travelers checks, \$5,781.09 in employee payroll checks and \$2043.70 in cash and checks payable to AAA.

Burglars burned through the three-inch thick safe door with cutting torches after removing the office safe to the furnace room.

"IT'S THE FIRST time a safe that thick was ever burned through around here," said Detective Lt. Merin Holmquist. "It was definitely a professional safecracking job."

The burglary was the second attempt in two years to crack a safe at the AAA office. The first was unsuccessful.

The theft was reported by Jack Simson of Birmingham AAA who discovered the open safe upon arriving for work Friday morning.

"In these confused, but perilous days, we need to know more of the truth about economics, which includes taxation," stated Shaw.

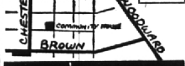
