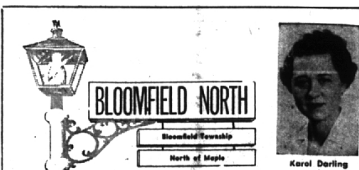
**BLOOMFIELD VILLAGE**—Mr. and Mrs. John Dykstra returned last week from a three-week motor
