# NOW for the BUSINESS!

GRASS will not grow any better without fertilizer than will a rose, petunia, orchid or salpiglossis. At this TIME it needs 100 lbs. of 10-6-4 (or 50 lbs. of 20-10-5) to each 5000 sq. ft.

2. ROSES need the continual protection of the mound of dirt and the mulch until the "freeze & thaw" routine is completed.

CRABGRASS can be effectively controlled if the material it abhors is applied BEFORE the seeds germ-inate. Let's say May 1st to be on the safe side.

4. HARD FROST is so unpredictable and damaging that we feel you should know that the average last hard frost date in this area is May 10th, On March 30th the 7:00 a.m. (the hour we get down to start the breakfast) temperature was 24°. On the 31st it was 27°.

Freezing alone is not harmful. It is the alternate freezing and thawing that does the damage as it separates the roots from the soil and promotes root rotten (or rotten roots) by golly. Keep them covered for another week or so.

5. DORMANT SPRAYS involve the most difficult ming of the season. Why?


