### Lathrup Appoints Paying Agent for \$230,000 in Bonds

LATHRUP — The contract with the Southeastern Oakland County Incinerator Authority was approved and a paying agent named for \$230,000 in sanitary sewer bonds.

Lathrup was the final municipal-ity to okay the incinerator contract, following on the heels of Madison Heights. The latter city approved the contract Monday.

The National Bank of Detroit was appointed paying agent for the bond issue.

In other business, council members set their sights for a Monday night goal for settlement of the easement question in front of the Lathrup Village Cooperative Nursery School.

THE MEETING came to life briefly when Mrs. Charles Kelley warned the council she would sue the city if council turned down proposed amendments to the zoning ordinance.

The amendments propose multiple dwelling on portions of 12 Mile Road and was rejected by the Zoning Board early in the year. The board then recommended further review.

The council met with residents from the affected area recently to delve into possible solutions to utilization of the 12 Mile Road properties.

On the easement question, City Attorney Everett Hayes told the council that the Kelley offer to deed some property along the front of the nursery school lot would not be feasible.

HAYES SAID it would be illegal for Lathrup to take title to a street in another municipality. Involved here is land and road property located in Southfield.

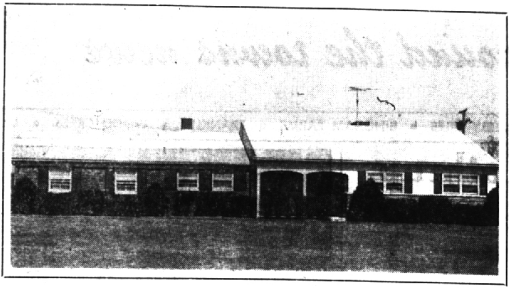

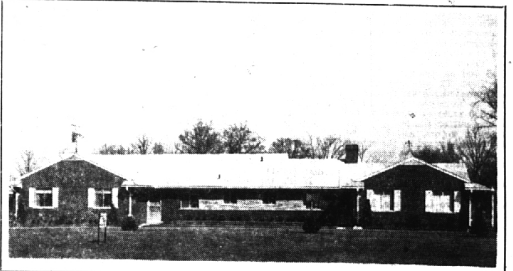

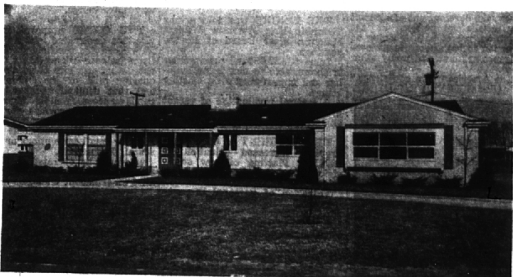
