The opinion that when a course developed in the manner of Oakland Hills is completed, the player with the best shot, the best equipment, the swiftest swing and considerable nerve control has the best chance to win a tournament over

"IN MY OPINION," said J. J. Hogan, "I think that after ten years, Oakland Hills still is the greatest test of championship golf in the world. There have been few changes since 1951. Seven traps have been taken out of them in the changing area. This leaves a total of 113 traps. Five greens have been modified, providing for additional pin placements.

Though some traps have been taken out and others widened somewhat, what depends on what the U.S.G.A. and others recommend does concerning the rough.

THE FURN 15-17 Open will be the fourth at Oakland Hills. Only two clubs have been host as often and none have been chosen more frequently.

Cyril Walker won with 297 in 1954. Ralph Guldani established a record with 281 in 1937 over the longest course in Open History, 7,037 yards.

Hogan came through with a 76, 71 and finished with one of only two sub-par rounds, a 67, to win with 287 in 1951. He had 59 par holes, 14 birdies, 17 boges and two double boges.

What about the Hogan of 1961?

"THE SWING is still there," says Oakland Hills pro Al Watrous, "three-time PGA Senior champion. Ben has too much pride to just be a contentant."

Hogan has had difficulty on his short putts lately, but from the tee to green, his game still is flawless. Heavy favorites for this year's classics are Arnold Palmer, 1960 Open champion and all-time high money winner, and transplanted South African Gary Player, who has already won more than \$20,000 in tourney payoffs this year.

SIXTY-ONE qualifying sites have been set in anticipation of a record entry for the 1961 National Open, the USGA announced Saturday.

Last year 2,453 players entered preliminary competition. A double qualifying round is again scheduled. Approximately 20 per cent of the low scorers in the 61 sectional trials.

The trials at the 61 sites will be held May 19, 22 and 23. Three of them are in Michigan. Detroit-area golfers will compete at Orchard Lake and Tam O'Shanter May 22.

TRIALS ALSO will be held the same day at Rhythmfield Country Club in Grand Haven, Mich. Grosse Ile Golf and Country Club will be the site of one of the 61 sectional trials June 6.

Defending champion Palmer and the titleholders of the previous four years are among 20 players exempt from all trials. Watrous, as best pro, is also exempt.

The 20 will be among the starting field of 150 of the best golfers in the world.

Volume III, lists him in its tenth edition.

He received both his BS and MA degrees in mathematics, physics and aeronautical engineering from Wayne State University in 1949 and 1950, respectively. He completed all course work for his Ph.D. degree at the University of Michigan.

HIS PRESENT position as supervisory mathematician at Bendix sons a career that began in the aeronautics field in 1940, with Bell Aircraft.

During the war years, he worked as an airplane designer at the U.S. Army Air Force Development Center at Wright Field, Ohio. Under this phase of his career, will undoubtedly be one which his two sons can regard their children for he worked in a section nicknamed "Hook Race."

FROM THE GERMAN plans and designs for a range of weapons that came to him here, he added the result of his personal studies and compiled a plan for a floating "island" in outer space.
