His automotive experience dates back to 1919 when he went to work for the Clayton - Lambert Manufacturing Co., which later became Hudson Motor Car Co.

In 1954, Dykstra began a 13-year association with the Oldsmobile Division of General Motors Corp. Five years later, he became general superintendent and assistant factory manager. In 1941, he was named manufacturing manager, a post he held until joining Ford.

DYKSTRA was born in The Netherlands in 1898, and moved to Detroit as a young man, attending night school where he studied tool and die design.

He furthered his education with correspondence courses in foremanship and related subjects at LaSalle University.

**Unofficial Victory**  
**For Thomas Adams**

Although final results of a closely contested race for a seat on Wayne State Board of Governors have not been officially announced by the State Board of Canvassers, it appears that Thomas B. Adams, 581 Harpsdale, Birmingham, is the victor over Ralph E. Richman of Holland, Mich.

Tabulations by both United Press International and Associated Press following the general election April 3 gave Adams the victory by a less than 1,000 vote margin. Adams, 41, Republican candidate, is president of Campbell-Ewald advertising firm.
