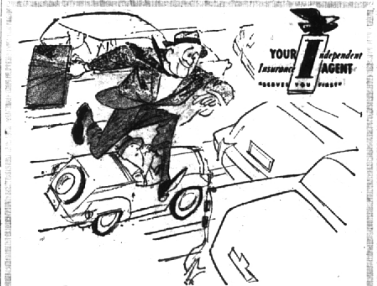
When his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Harry Brody, were unable to wedge him from his predicament, they called for help. Police and firemen
