

**Nab Detroit Youths Ransacking Building**

**SOUTHFIELD** — Four Detroit youths, apprehended by Southfield police on April 9 at the Ben-B-Q King, 28066 Northwestern Highway, were arraigned Friday in front of Municipal Judge Clarence Reid. They were bound over to Circuit Court.

Peter Shecter, 17, Darrell Enneking, 17, Edward C. Reno and Van Bank DeLashmott, 11, 18, were arrested when police found them ransacking the restaurant.

Officer Cass Gaska fired a warn-

ing shot when he observed Shecter running from the building. Shecter stopped.

Meanwhile Officer James Kirkpatrick found a door open in the building and was joined by Police Officers William Kemper, Manuel Henderlong and Russell Thompson. The officers arrested the other three youths within the building.

Shecter pleaded not guilty and the other three pleaded guilty when arraigned before Judge Reid.

work (heading the township road committee compatible with his own job in the public relations work of the Automobile Manufacturers Association, which maintains a great interest in good roads.

As explained by Chapman, the road committee uses three criteria in selection of roads to be improved in the township. They are: (1) surveys as to amount of road traffic, studies by township planning consultants, Villanueva, Villanueva and Associates, to where township growth is taking place more rapidly, and basic research data in a 1955 survey — with projections to 1980 — as to traffic density and origin and destination of the traffic.

Working with the committee with him are township trustees, Gordon Getsinger and Henry Hogan Jr., and Police Chief Norman Dwinke.

**THE REPORT** made by Chapman shows that in 1960 and '61 more than \$175,000 of road improvements will have been made in the township. Having been done on a matching funds basis with Oakland County Road Commission, and with the Village of Franklin participating in one project with the township, the cost to Bloomfield has been less than half that figure.

The 1961 improvement project includes Lone Pine Road between Lahser and Telegraph, estimated at \$100,000, and one-half mile of Quanton Road east of Telegraph to the southern point of Gilbert Lake.

**CHAPMAN** proudly points out that the Quanton Road improvement will make Quanton a paved road from Adams to Franklin Road.

"Since most of the major routes are north and south roads, we are in need of improving east-west collector roads, connecting subdivision roads to primary roads," Chapman says of the overall strategy of the road committee.

**AND WITH** the township board supporting the improvement program, Fred Chapman is going to do his part in seeing that the committee reaches its objective.

to the township board a budget need of approximately \$50,000 for 1961. A reconciliation between the two figures must be made.

**GENERAL GLOOM** over the township's financial plight led township officials to take two money saving steps at the township board meeting last Wednesday. A \$5,000 road chloring program which township has sponsored each year has been put off until a review of the budget has been made.
