 occurred at Baltimore. The Sixth Massachusetts Regiment, passing through the city, collided in riot with an armed crowd of Southern sympathizers and when it ended, 11 citizens and four soldiers lay dead.

And the following day at Norfolk, Va., at the mouth of the Chesapeake bay, a force of Union soldiers sailed into the large federal navy yard, which was not yet in Confederate hands. When they left early the next morning, the whole installation was aflame, with ships sinking at their anchorage. Next week: Enter Lee and Grant.

 prestige to his political experience. SOME OF the projects initiated during his mayoralty were the Baldwin Library addition, municipal parking lots and Springdale Park clubhouse.

While Denyes has seen a lot of political turnover, policy and procedure haven't changed since his first term of political office in 1948. Functioning with the same harmony and dedication of former years, the commissioners operate on the principle that to be effective a commission must work toward developing an informed citizenry, said Denyes.

"Problems are created when people aren't informed of the facts of a given issue," he said. "In Birmingham we are constantly striving to present the facts and educate the public."

THIS IS where the establishment of a good working relationship between commissioners is necessary in serving the people, said Denyes.

"Although we've had differences of opinions, it has never come to major splits over issues. Considering politics a broadening experience in finance, engineering, management and personnel, Denyes sums up his political venture as being "quite an education."

 (Fairway Subdivision). 2. Transportation of children from Frasin Village in the area bounded by 13 Mile, Telegraph, Oakleaf, and the southern boundary of the district to Midvale School. 3. Continuance of transportation of students from Bloomfield Village to Midvale. 4. Removal of the two special education rooms from Valley Woods to Baldwin School. 5. Transportation of all sixth graders to the Pembroke attendance area to Adams School.

A COUNSELOR will be on duty during the summer at Groves and Seabolt High Schools for the first time. Since the schools are offering more differentiated courses, the board feels the process of scheduling students in appropriate programs is becoming more complex.

The counselors will process a transfer of students from other school districts during July and August, thereby avoiding the accumulation of work in the fall. Playgrounds at Harlan and Midvale Schools will be improved for speed of Little League baseball diamonds. The board voted to spend \$1200 at Harlan and \$300 at Midvale for rough grading of the lots. Representatives of Parent-Teachers Association and Little League will contribute matching funds for the projects.

THE RESIGNATION of James Burchett, principal of Groves, was accepted by the board. A member of the Birmingham school system since 1956, Burchett resigned to accept the position of assistant superintendent of the Grand Blanc, Mich., public schools.

Arnold Berndt's converted status from part-time to full-time Coordinator of Music was approved by the board. The change becomes effective July 1. Appropriation of \$12,470 was approved for roof repairs at Derby School.

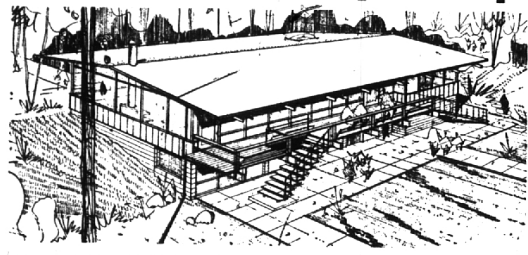

 A. Apparently not. The old notion that pregnancy robs the mother's teeth of calcium and thus causes cavities has been disproved by several medical investigators. But the expectant mother shouldn't neglect her teeth. The best time for extensive dental work is probably between the twentieth and twenty-eighth weeks of pregnancy. This is especially true if the dental work requires general anesthesia rather than use of a local anesthetic. Minor tooth troubles can and should be attended to any time before the baby arrives.
