## Young to Address TB, Health Society

Dr. Donald C. S. Young, 136 Bassett Place, Birmingham, internationally-known lecturer, will be the principal speaker at the annual luncheon meeting of the Tuberculosis and Health Society at the Veterans Memorial Building in Detroit on Tuesday.

Dr. Young, a native of Edinburgh, Scotland, will speak on "The Freedom to Give." A former member of the Gordon Highlanders, he came to the United States after World War I as an unskilled hourly worker in the auto industry.

LATER, HE completed his college and university training and graduated from Mercer University, Macon, Ga. In the years since, Dr. Young has served as youth counselor, minister, college professor, writer and lecturer. For the past 17 years Dr. Young has lectured throughout the United States and Canada. Appearing before business, industrial, civic and religious groups, he directs his efforts to rebuilding the climate for the American way of life in world leadership.

At present he is engaged in lecturing, writing and independent research in educational systems in the western world. He also serves as a consultant in higher education to business institutions.

DR. YOUNG will appear before the TB fighters through the courtesy of General Motors Corporation.

During the meeting a new board of directors will be elected and persons who have been outstanding in their volunteer work for the TB and Health Society will be honored.

# MSUO Chancellor Says Appropriation Lacking

"If the current Lansing appropriation for higher education is passed, MSUO eventually will be destroyed," Dr. Young said.

Those were the words of D. B. Varner, chancellor of Michigan State University in East Lansing. He made the statement while discussing recent conflicts between LL Gov. John T. Leiniski and "moderate" Republicans.

## Ct. Extension Hearing Set

Inability of three private parties to reach agreement that would provide access to property owned by one of them has led Birmingham city commissioners to set a public hearing on necessity to extend Kenwood Court.

Obert Bros brothers, owners of landlocked property at the eastern end of the street in the north-west corner of the city, have asked the City for variance in a city ordinance that would allow them to cut the curb in front of their property to provide ingress and egress.

Louis J. Obert said he has been unable to purchase property from either of two owners of parcels abutting his.

WITHOUT PURCHASE of a portion of the front of either of these parcels or the curb cut, Obert would have no access to his property.

Monday night, commissioners set a public hearing on necessity to extend the eastern end of Kenwood 55.8 feet for May 8. If the street is extended, Obert would have access to his property.

Commissioners also granted permission for the curb cut on condition that it be abandoned when the street is opened or at such time as other access is gained. The curb cut would then be restored at cost of the petitioner.

As it turned out, according to "moderates," Leiniski "double-crossed" the Republicans and both proposed bills fell through.

And according to Varner, MSUO received the short end of the deal.

IF THE telephone tax, which will be discontinued June 30, would have been continued, the extra \$2,500,000 would have in part come to us and the situation would not have been so bad," said Varner.

"We're heading into our third year of operation. We are now operating on an appropriation of \$870,720. We have 908 students. We anticipate 1,400 students for the third year and requested an appropriation of \$1,420,500 based on existing per student appropriations plus \$65,000 to finance the first year of our proposed tri-

ter plan which will go into effect Sept. 1. "GEO. SWAINSON recommended \$1,157,000 for MSUO based on his assumption that we would only have 1,200 students for the third year. "The senate Friday passed a bill which made no specific allocation for MSUO, but Michigan State University President John Hannah said we would get \$862,020—which is just \$12,200 more than we received last year. "This poses serious problems. "We've already employed 13 new faculty and five new staff members for the coming year and have offers outstanding for two more faculty members. We also have the added maintenance expenses for the Kresge Library and Science Building which will be ready for operation for the third year. "If we stop everything right where we are, \$257,000 has already been committed against us which is \$12,300 promised us. "If the proposed appropriation stands, the net long term fact is that MSUO eventually will be destroyed."
