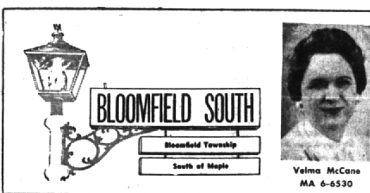




**Smiling Sorority Sisters**
