Birmingham's municipal parking program was one of the decisive factors in locating here, said But-

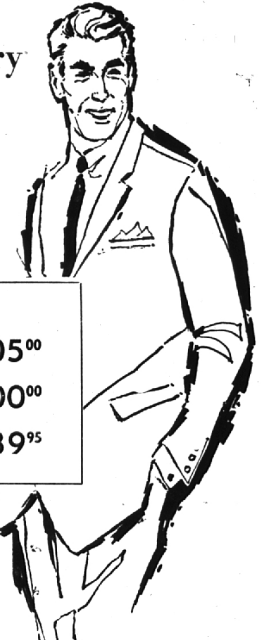
ler, who is a Bloomfield Village resident. He stated: "Our studies showed Birmingham is the best, the most practical location for our second store."

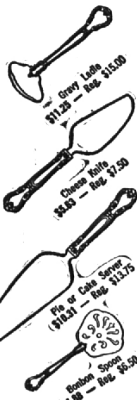

tant phase of this Cuban aftermath. When our U. N. Ambassador Adlai Stevenson stood up in the U. N.'s General Assembly, defending his country's defense of freedom, not a single other UN member rose to stand with Stevenson; they all remained quiet—even England, France, West Germany, and others of our presumed Allies.

Does this offer proof of just how our own nation could fare, were we to join in a World Government? Does this "standing alone" not demand that the United States continue to retain its own sovereignty? We should, I believe, reject every attempt to bring the U. S. A. to the position of being only one vote in a world-body whose unwillingness to stand up with its best, most dependable Ally is, alas, sufficient proof that Uncle Sam had better never forget that the United Nations organization has definite limitations to preserve world unanimity for the cause of peace.
