## B'ham Speeds Up Purchase Of 5 Autos

Birmingham City Commission is sympathetic to the needs of local car dealers, Commissioner Robert Page emphasized Monday night. Page said it may have appeared at last week's meeting that the commission was not sympathetic with the dealers in merchandising their product. Commissioners rejected a proposal to permit dealers to park new cars on city sidewalks.

—Though while we are sympathetic, we do have reservations about the method's they suggested, especially to waive one of our ordinances," said Page. This week, commissioners approved purchase of five cars at \$4,259.48, after trade-ins. "To help encourage car sales,

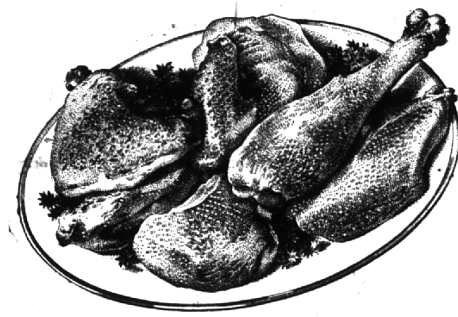

Willett said this should give confidence to those persons desirous of dedicating parks that positive steps were being taken toward that end. Commissioner Charles Renfrew agreed to asking for the report but felt "strongly" that there was no urgency to act now.
