Redeemer Installs \$22,000 Steeple

A new \$22,000 steeple will soon tower over Lutheran Church of the Redeemer at 1800 W. Maple. The lead coated copper spire measuring 100 feet will be installed within the next month. Workmen have been working on the project since Easter. The base of the structure is near completion. The steeple will replace the one installed when the church was built in 1941. According to Pastor Theodore Wuzargler, the new steeple will harmonize with the grounds and increase maintenance expenses.
