## British Rector Will Visit First Baptist

The Venerable R. C. O. Goodchild, archdeacon of Northampton and a rector of the Church of England, will be the house guest of Birmingham First Baptist Church Sunday. He will speak at the 10 a.m. worship service.

Expected to arrive Friday for a three-day visit in Birmingham, Mr. Goodchild will be the house guest of Mr. and Mrs. Iguis B. Crooks, 506 Yorkton Lane, Birmingham.

His visit will be one of several made by foreign Protestant ministers throughout the country as part of an international exchange program sponsored annually by the National Council of Churches.

AS ARCHDEACON and rector, he supervises 220 parishes while personally serving the parish of Eton.

Son of an English missionary, Mr. Goodchild was born in New South Wales, Australia, and received his education in England.

Following service as a chaplain in the Royal Air Force during World War II, he was warden of St. Michael's House in Hamburg, Germany, where he supervised the training and spiritual rehabilitation of ex-Nazi youth leaders.

THE REV. DR. HOMER J. ARMSTRONG, pastor of Birmingham Baptist Church, will conduct Sunday's service. He has participated in the exchange program, spending a summer preaching in English churches.

## Residents Plan Choirs For Episcopal Confab

The task of recruiting, training and coordinating 1500 choir members scattered throughout eastern Michigan for the 90th General Convention of the Protestant Episcopal Church is being undertaken by a Bloomfield Hills and a Beverly Hills resident.

Mrs. Rogers Marquis, 1553 Island Lane, Bloomfield Hills, convention music committee co-chairman, and Kent McDonald, 15643 Birchwood, Beverly Hills, St. James Episcopal Church organist and choirmaster, will assist in organizing two separate choirs of 750 voices for the Sept. 17-22 convention in Detroit's Cobo Hall.

McDONALD WILL direct one choir composed of choristers from 40 out-state parishes and missions. Organist for this choir will be Dr. August Maskeberghe, organist and

choirmaster of St. John's in Detroit.

The second choir made up of choristers from 42 Detroit and suburban parishes and missions will be directed by Elwood Hill, choirmaster at Christ Church, Grosse Pointe. This choir's organist will be Edgar Billups of All Saints' Church, Pontiac.

Each choir will be composed of 120 tenors, 150 basses, 180 altos and the rest sopranos.

THE REV. WARD Chabesche, rector of St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Allen Park, is chairman of the music committee.

Convention highlights will be the opening service at 7:30 a.m. Sept. 17 and the missionary Mass meeting at 8 p.m. Sept. 22. The choir will perform for both events.

## Youths Organize Discussion Group

A concern for world affairs has prompted some 20 senior high school youths of the Congregational Church of Birmingham to meet throughout the summer for discussion of major world issues.

The weekly Wednesday meetings, held at the homes of the participants, combine recreation and fellowship with study and discussion. Organized and led by Mrs. Mead M. Bailey, teacher in the Sunday School's high school department and wife of the church's associate minister, the sessions call upon members of the group to serve as resource persons.

DISCUSSIONS ARE based on various reference sources such as the Foreign Policy Association's "Great Decisions Program," the Council for Christian Social Action of the United Church of Christ, and newspaper and magazine articles.

Discussion subjects for the remainder of the summer include "The Christian and the Arms Race," "What is a Christian Family?" "Visions of the End—A Look at the Book of Revelation," "Christian Witness in South America" and "Complacency, Conformity and Christ."
