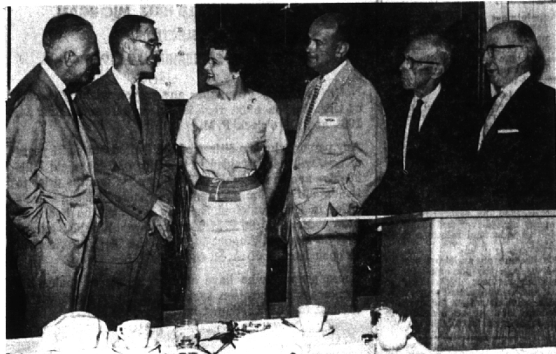

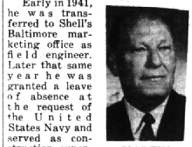


Breakfast Discussion

Outlook Good, Says Banker At Breakfast

The economic outlook is good says John Watkins, assistant vice president at Detroit Bank and Trust. Speaking recently to over 150 business people from Birmingham and many surrounding communities at a bank-sponsored breakfast, Watkins cited four indicators that businessmen should watch in determining how the economy is progressing.

Watkins spoke of manufacturers' inventories, U. S. vehicle production, housing starts, and plant and equipment expenditures as four dynamic forces that can indicate how the American economy is progressing. Watkins did not predict a boom, but he said that some of these forces are beginning to swing upwards.

"If they all begin to swing up together," he said, "it would cause a strong recovery late in 1961 and the business economy would definitely start upwards. As businessmen we should all be prepared to take full advantage of this possibility," he advised.

The meeting was the sixth of a current series of "business breakfasts" being held by Detroit Bank and Trust as a special service to its customers in several Detroit and suburban areas. Another breakfast is planned for the area served by the Northland Center office of the bank. In 1960, the bank conducted a similar series on the importance of personal political participation.

Self-Service Dry Cleaning Here Friday

Automatic, self-service dry cleaning will arrive in Birmingham Friday with the opening of a Nages Laundry and Cleaning Village at 1666 S. Woodward. George Scott will be manager of the business which will have grand-opening Friday and Saturday. The development permits the user to do personal dry cleaning for the first time. The machines operate like a coin-operated washer.

THE DRY CLEANING unit will clean anything from a man's suit to girls' party dresses. It is designed to clean eight pounds of garments (3 or 4 men's suits or 8 dresses) in approximately 50 minutes.

The cleaner utilizes a specially formulated cleaning solvent. It employs the new cleaning solvent developed by Norge and Borg-Warner, called Norge-Clor, which leaves the garment "wrinkle-free". Complete coin-operated laundry facilities featuring washers and dryers will make the new laundry and Cleaning Village a complete laundering and cleaning service.

B'ham Man Forms New Company

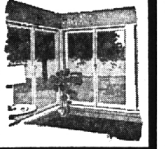

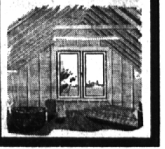
