**Rev. Albrecht Replaces

The Rev. John H. Albrecht has replaced the Rev. Lester I. Dobyns as associate rector at Christ Church Cranbrook.

Rev. Dobyns, who has been with Christ Church five years, has accepted a position as director of the Episcopal Diocese of Michigan in Detroit. He will assume his duties Sept. 1.

Rev. and Mrs. Dobyns and their two sons, Stephen and Chris, will continue to live at 967 Forest in Birmingham.

The Kirk Sunday**

A clergyman-author, whose latest book "The Storm and the Rainbow" was a best seller, will visit Kirk in the Hills Sunday.

The Rev. Dr. Lowell R. Ditzen, pastor of The Reformed Church in Bronxville, N. Y., who is nationally known for his writings and radio-television appearances, will speak at the 9:30 and 11:30 a.m. services.
