**Ask Laundry-Cleaning Law; More Information Desired**

Birmingham city commissioners want more information before they decide to consider a possible ordinance to regulate self-serve laundry and dry cleaning establishments.  
 After discussing a report from City Manager L. R. Gare Monday night, they decided they want more facts before taking any action.  
 Gare pointed out that one self-serve laundry has opened in the city in the past month and that a self-serve dry-cleaning plant is expected to be in operation within the next 30 days.

HE SAID the National Board of Fire Underwriters recommends such establishments be under constant supervision while the buildings are open to the public.  
 Gare also pointed to reports of crimes occurring in unattended, coin-operated businesses.

"It is our suggestion," he said, "that these places have an attendant at all hours as a safety and crime precaution."  
 "I cannot think of a more unlikely breeding place for crime,"

he stated.  
 Reid said he had encountered no fires, crimes or vandalism in his stores.

COMMISSIONER William H. Burgess said he wants more information as to why the two types of business should be included in one ordinance.  
 "I would have to see the necessity before I could agree to combining the two."

He drew agreement from Commissioner Charles Renslow, who said he would "like to see more evidence" that the two should be linked together.  
 "Such an ordinance would legislate these establishments out of business," Renslow declared.

SAID COMMISSIONER William E. Roberts:  
 "I would have to be sold a little more before I could consent to directing the city attorney to prepare an ordinance."  
 Roberts said further, "If evidence is brought in that there is a fire hazard or that these places are a crime trap, we would be interested, and I believe Mr. Reid would be interested."

Otherwise, he felt, nothing was needed.  
 Burgess pointed out that there would have to be a question of health or welfare.

**B'ham Man Named to CD Position**

A Birmingham resident has been appointed a member of the National Defense Executive Reserve.  
 He is Bethel B. Kelley, 640 Honley, who is a partner in the law firm of Cross, Wreck, Miller, Vieson and Kelley.  
 Kelley was appointed by Frank B. Ellis, director of the Office of Civil and Defense Mobilization.  
 The NDER is composed of top level executives from various segments of the nation's economy. Its members are especially selected and trained for appointment to Federal executive positions during national emergencies.

CELLEY HAS BEEN assigned to OGDIM Region 4, Battle Creek. He will serve as a member of the Regional Economic Stabilization Board, which is responsible for assisting in development of measures to combat inflation in event of war.

Comprising Region 4 are Michigan, Illinois, Indiana, Minnesota and Wisconsin.  
 Kelley has practiced law in Detroit since 1937. He is a member of the Michigan, Kentucky and American Bar associations, Detroit Athletic and Orchard Lake Country clubs.

To be a successful driver you should use both your exterior and interior rear view mirrors often and properly, advises Automobile Club of Michigan. They say as eyes in the back of your head, and help to "Bring 'em Back Alive!" every time you drive, always know what traffic conditions are behind you. A check in your rear view mirror keeps you aware of what is going on, and helps you anticipate traffic problems before they arise. It is essential that you use your rear view mirror when you slow down, stop, park, turn to the right or left, pass another car, change lanes, back up, or turn around. If a car overtakes you by surprise, or appears out of nowhere when you are turning, it is probably because you haven't been using your rear view mirror to its best advantage. One of the most essential safety devices on your car, it helps keep you fully informed, and, in driving as in other things, the most intelligent action is taken by the most fully informed persons.
