### Area Golfers Qualify for State Open

Four Birmingham area golfers were included in the 38 who qualified Monday for the Michigan Open at Farmington Country Club.

Jack Clark, Franklin Hills, led area qualifiers with a 37-37-74. Forest Lake's Lincoln Jackson fired a 39-37-76. Jim Bradford, Orchard Lake, and Jerry Nagle, Birmingham Country Club, shot 77's. There are 127 players exempt from qualifying.

CASS JAWOR, Rackham, was medalist with a two-under-par 70. He was the only one to break par.

More than 150 entrants vied for the remaining positions in the Open which will be played August 18-20 at Farmington.

The last titleholder from this area was Franklin Hills' Walter Burkeno who won the championship in 1967. He also was champ in 1965 and 1950.

Oakland Hills' old pro Al Watrous has won the Michigan Open six times, more than any other golfer. His first title came in 1929, the last in 1949.

The great Walter Hagen won the title in its second year, 1921. John Harnum took the Open last year.
