Romney Talk To Highlight GOP Fun-Day

Okland County Republicans will give Con-Con a massive boost Aug. 26 when they stage the 2nd annual GOP Family Fun-Day at the John F. Ivory farm near Union Lake Village.

Several thousand party followers are expected to turn out for the event. The program will feature an address on Con-Con by George Romney, American Motors Corp. president and GOP Con-Con nominee from Oakland's 12th senatorial district. Swimming, games and food will be available.

Miller to Attend MEA Conference

George Miller of Birmingham will join over 100 educators from throughout the state for the annual fall meeting of the Michigan Education Association's board of directors, commissions and committees. The meeting will be held Aug. 25-26 at the MEA Camp at St. Mary's Lake near Battle Creek.

The 100 teachers and administrators attending make up the 18-member board of directors, three standing commissions and three standing committees that chart the direction and evaluate the progress of the 58,000-member association.

THE BOARD WILL make appointments to commissions and committees and hear reports and recommendations from the latter in the areas of membership, teacher certification, professional rights of teachers, and implementation of the MEA platform and resolutions. Also on the agenda will be the consideration of proposed building plans for the MEA headquarters building (north of M-78 at Abbott Road) and appointment of a Michigan chairman for the 1963 NEA Detroit convention.

City Delays Action on Access Alley

City Commission action on a proposed dedication for public use and paving of a stretch of land near the Hunter water tank site was postponed for the second time Monday night.

John V. Manikoff, Bloomfield Hills representative who is representing Ridgeland residents and obtained the first postponement last week, was granted another delay until next Monday's meeting.

Registering clients' objection to the proposed dedication, Manikoff claimed it would invite traffic which would be dangerous for some 30 children in the area.

The 29-FOOT wide access extends from Hunter Blvd. easterly to the Hunter water tank. It was acquired by the city in 1941 and paving of the alley was recently requested by Birmingham realtors Ward and Smith.

Dedication to public use and paving of the strip would provide property owners to the north and south access to their property. As public land the strip could be used as an alley.

If the alley is dedicated to the public, the city would be in a position to assess the cost of the proposed pavement in an equitable manner against the benefitting abutting properties.

A report on the matter will be considered at Monday night's commission meeting.
