that the state's distinguished record does not place the state beyond improvement.

"A serious question remains," he said.

"Just how much, generally, do we want further improvement? How much are we willing to stand for in self-restraint, inconvenience, regulation and cost of services that will help improve the accident situation?"

YESTERDAY'S CONFERENCE and the five that will follow it in other areas of the state this month were designed to arrive at answers to this and other key questions.

The day-long conference continued in panel discussions and workshops in which state representatives, mayors, city managers, county supervisors, sheriffs, police chiefs and residents joined ideas to strengthen the state's traffic safety program.

of all reports and recommendations in the intervening months by the board and the administration. After many revisions, a tentative five-year budget projection resulted. This, along with the building needs report, supporting data and the board's tentative recommendations, has been sent to all who indicated they could serve on the committee.

"WE HOPE THAT a mutual exchange of ideas on our tentative recommendations will enable us to formulate the best possible proposals for the November election," said Mrs. Loomis.

The first meeting of this advisory committee with the board will be held today.

So-called "regional interests" within Michigan "must not be exploited as an excuse for fractionalizing the voting power of the people."

That's what Asher N. Tilchin, Democratic candidate for Constitutional Convention Delegate from the third federal district, said at a meeting in the home of Mr. and Mrs. John A. Cooper, 288 Pilgrim, Birmingham.

"STATES rights," the Bloomfield Township lawyer-businessman said, "are a logical basis for federal constitutional provisions which grant each state—regardless of size—equal representation in the United States Senate. But there is no such thing as 'regional rights' within the state of Michigan. Each citizen must and should have equal voting rights."

Amplifying his remarks on the subject of reapportionment, which he said he considers the first task of the Con-Con delegates when they meet on October 4, Tilchin said Michigan is not partitioned into rural and urban, industrial and agricultural districts.

HERE IN THE third legislative district, we have every type of "regional interest"—we have farmers and workers, businessmen and industrialists. And it would make as much sense to stratify this little district into "regions" as it does to attempt to allocate votes in Michigan on a fictitious regional basis.

"Minority rights," Tilchin said, "are properly protected by the Declaration of Rights and other safeguards. But you don't protect a minority by giving it control of the majority, which is exactly what happens when unequal voting power is arbitrarily assigned. What we must have," he concluded, "is simply this: One full vote for every citizen of Michigan."

Internal Revenue Office Relocates

The Pontiac branch office of the U. S. Internal Revenue Service which services Oakland County moved Monday from 85 Oakland Ave. to the Federal Building at Perry and Huron Streets in Pontiac.

The entrance to the basement office is located on Mill Street at the rear of the Federal Building. The Pontiac Social Security of-

face is scheduled to relocate on the first floor of the Federal Building about Sept. 1.

REASON for the move is to consolidate all federal offices in a government owned building, thereby saving rental costs, according to Lyle D. Russell, administrative representative for R. L. Nixon, Michigan District Director of Internal Revenue.
