

New Teachers Due At Cranbrook Schools

"Have you seen the new teacher?" will be an oft-repeated question at Cranbrook, Kingswood and Brookside Schools this fall.

Sixteen new faculty members are on the staff of Kingswood School for Girls. Six new staff members will greet students at Cranbrook School for Boys and two at Brookside School.

Classes will begin at Cranbrook on Sept. 20. Kingswood girls will start one day earlier and Brookside pupils begin classes Sept. 13.

Attendance at Cranbrook will remain at about last year's enrollment of 370, with new boys reporting Sept. 18 and older boys registering the 19th.

The first faculty meeting will be held Sept. 14.

AMONG THE new staff members at Cranbrook is Peter P. Slader, new director of athletics. New teachers include Franklin

Henry Geist mathematics instructor; David M. Allan, head of lower school and mathematic instructor; and John A. Laskarides, English instructor.

The two other new Cranbrook faculty members are Dave Barney, physical education instructor and John Bailey Lloyd, English instructor.

Slader will also act as football coach.

Enrollment at Kingswood is also expected to be about the same as last year's at 292 pupils. New students will meet Sept. 17 at 4 p.m. Registration will be the following day from 9 to 11:30 a.m. and from 1:45 to 3 p.m.

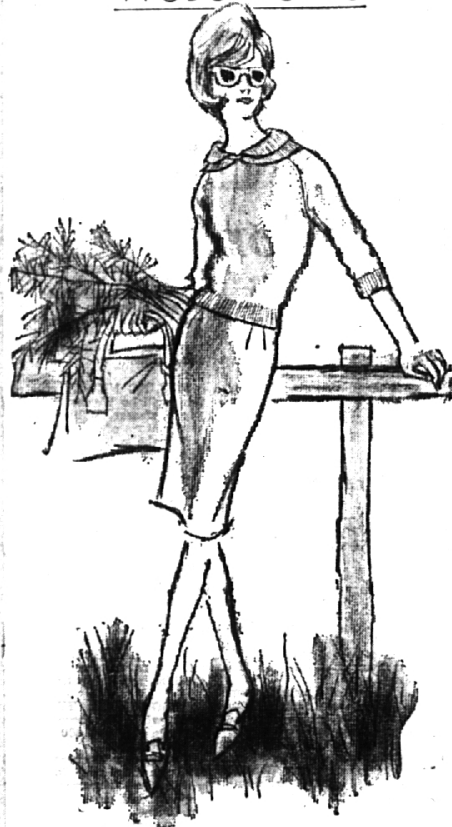
