In initiating this action, secondary principals have made appointments in the academic subject areas. Increasing the supervisory staff will fulfill one of the major recommendations of the Citizens Committee Studying Curriculum appointed by the Parent-Teacher Association Council.

The newly appointed chairmen will assist in curriculum evaluation and development and the supervision of classroom instruction. Each will be required to teach two or more classes with the remainder of the day devoted to their newly assigned duties.

In addition to an excellent grasp of the content of his subject area, each has displayed a high degree of administrative and leadership skill.

Slated for department chairman posts for the coming school year in English are Katherine Blunt, Margaret Freiwald, Katherine Peters, and Della Webb.
