

### Prudential Agency In New Quarters - In Southfield City

The Prudential Insurance Company's Willard A. Guerber and Associates Agency moved Monday to new quarters 17300 Northland Park Court, Southfield.

Former quarters were 20104 James Couzens Highway, Detroit.

Manager Willard Guerber said today that Prudential will occupy 6,420 square feet on the first floor of the two-story glazed brick building.

THE BUILDING was recently completed by the Paul H. Johnson Inc. construction firm at a cost of about \$225,000. Owners are Mr. and Mrs. Harry Berberian and Mr. and Mrs. D. Nislan. The Berberians also owned the building which the agency previously occupied. It was purchased by the highway department for widening the James Couzens Highway.

The new location also features 14 offices, recessed fluorescent lighting, wainscot paneling and central heating and air conditioning.

### Set Sewer Cost For Subdivision In Beverly Hills

BEVERLY HILLS—Nottingham Forest Subdivision Monday reached an agreement with the village council on the subdivision's financial share of sewer construction in the area.

The Nottingham agreement will be projected \$26,848.25 plus its portion of certified contingencies on the project.

The corporation is required to pay its bill by the time Giannetti Construction Company starts work in the vicinity, which, according to village officials, should be some time next week.

### Negligent Homicide Charge Dismissed In Auto Fatality

SOUTHFIELD — A charge of negligent homicide against Michael L. Patrick of Detroit was dismissed for lack of evidence Aug. 9 by Southfield Municipal Judge Clarence A. Reid Jr.

Patrick was involved in an auto accident June 29 which took the life of William Woosley, 19483 Greydale, a passenger in Patrick's car.

The dismissed charge alleged that Patrick made a left turn in front of a vehicle driven by Donald Parka, 25480 Telegraph.

The accident, which occurred at Nine Mile and Telegraph, caused injury to other passengers in Patrick's car.

### To Ask for Bids On Resurfacing Roads in Lathrup

LATHRUP — The 1959 special assessment road program moved closer to completion at Monday's council meeting.

City Administrator Jerald Stone said he directed to advertise for bids to surface parts of three streets. Bids for both concrete and gravel will be taken for one-half block of Bloomfield, up to the southern edge of the 11 Mile Road right-of-way.

Bids will also be taken for gravel for one block of Eldorado, between Goldensate and W. California, and for about 100 feet of Goldensate, near the eastern city limits.

EARLIER HOPES for concrete paving on Eldorado are apparently out of the question, Stone said. He has been unable to get the signature of one of many property owners residing in California.

City Attorney Everett Hayes said that 100 per cent approval of residents along three streets was necessary to permit concrete paving. The program has been delayed because of changes in type of surfacing desired by residents. As-built work was originally scheduled under the special assessment, then the program was approved following a public hearing.

The change to concrete was proposed by a local contractor, Western Construction Co.

THE DECISION Monday to take bids resulted when Stone said he had been unable to contact the contractor, Mr. and Mrs. Charles D. Kelley and two builders appeared at Monday's meeting to ask that the Bloomfield paving be completed.

They said the paving delay was interfering with completion of a house being constructed on Bloomfield.

Cost of paving must be no more than \$4,000 in the special assessment program, Hayes said.

### Swan Named Ad Manager
