close of last season and apparently are headed for another fruitful year. Not even Halas' return to head coaching duties has stirred fire and fight in the den. Halas and his army of assistant coaches may suffer indignities unmatched in this history of a club perhaps feared more than any other in pro football over the years.

The Bears have been defeated, but never have they been dismissed lightly. This year the Bears may be the patsy of the Western division.

HALAS AND George Preston Marshall, the somewhat deflated owner of the Washington Redskins, are the only genuine pro football pioneers still on hand. And the last of the old guard fights strongly but finally to hold on. Halas is witnessing the demise of the Bears, and Marshall has been struggling to keep control of his club. The federal government finally has obtained Marshall's promise to use Negro players, against George Preston's wishes.

This is only the last of a series of setbacks for Marshall. And his club appears weak again this season: the dissatisfaction with his direction of the club probably will mount again this fall.

It was Marshall's iron hand in operating the Redskins which snared Harry Wismer to start organizing the American Football League, now a genuine rival of the NFL. Wismer was a minority stockholder in the Redskins and clashed with Marshall.

Washington fans were happy to see Calvin Griffith leave Washington with his baseball team. Many would celebrate if Marshall departed, but without his football club—unless expansion of the NFL would give Washington a new organization.
