during the next five years.

SINCE THE board's present bonding authority totals \$1,700,000, an additional bonding authority request for \$2,800,000 is proposed for the November election ballot.

However, voter approval for issuance of the additional \$2,800,000 in bonds would not mean higher taxes for buildings. Accumulated reserves, the rate at which bonds from previous building programs are being paid off and increasing property valuations will yield sufficient funds to provide the required \$3,500,000.

WHILE REVISING the Ohio State immediate building needs budget, the school board and administration also developed a five-year operating budget to replace the present six-mill budget which expires in December.

This proposed operating budget incorporates the operating needs of the district based on estimated enrollment growth and program improvements recommended by the Citizens Curriculum Committee, and an improvement factor in teacher salaries to attract and retain quality instructors.

Projected over a five-year period the proposed operating budget would increase annually from the current 1961-62 budget of \$6,386,502 to the fifth year's 1966-67 budget of \$8,333,425.

THIS PROPOSED OPERATING levy would call for voter authorization of 2.6-mill increase over the present 6-mill levy in the November election.

To the taxpayer this increased millage would be equivalent to a tax increase of \$2.60 per year per each \$1,000 of state equalized property value.

Since tax bills are mailed the first of December, the additional tax would be levied until the following year, 1962.

The actual election ballot proposal would ask voter approval for an operating levy of 11 mills, five mills over the current six-mill levy. However, the actual increase would amount to 2.6 mills since the school board proposes reducing the present debt service millage of 7.4 by 2.4 mills in 1962. Accumulation of reserves, increase in property valuation and payment of the bonds issues would enable the board to reduce the debt service millage.

Thus, 2.6 mills of the additional five mills that would be requested in the election would be furnished through additional taxes and the remaining 2.4 mills would be provided through reduction of the debt service millage.

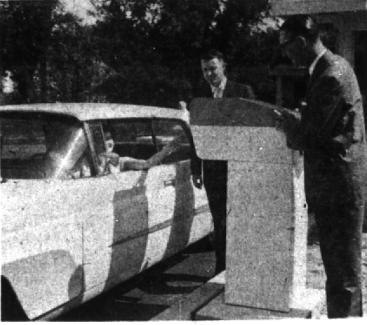
THE CITIZENS advisory committee and board of education are in the process of deciding whether these tentative building and operating proposals are realistic and in line with what the community wants.

No date has been set yet for the special election.

The final decision on the formulation of the proposals lies in the hand of education while the fate of the eventual proposals is in the hand of the voters.

## Troy Woman Slashed; Police Arrest Fireman

A Royal Oak fireman, arrested for the slaying of Mrs. Sharon Gravin, 27, of 2565 Rochester, Troy, stood mute and waived examination before Troy Municipal Judge Charles Losey Tuesday afternoon. Troy police detained him Monday night for investigation of felonious assault.

Mrs. Gravin was apprehended at 9:15 p.m. Monday by Troy Police Chief Dave Grattop as the fireman walked in his stocking feet along Rochester Road near 17 Mile Road, about a mile from his home.

THE SLASHING occurred Monday afternoon outside Mrs. Gravin's home at 1058 Henrietta. Mrs. Gravin and Gravin forced her and her four-year-old daughter, Tammy, out of her home at knife point. When she screamed, Gravin slashed her, she said.

Mrs. Gravin is the wife of the fireman's cousin.

Gravin, father of one child and stepfather of four children, told police he had been drinking and could not remember how he opened a cut requiring five stitches behind the left ear of Mrs. Gravin.
