GOP Nominees Offer AFL-CIO Con-Con Talks

Oakland County Republican Con-Con candidates recently offered to talk over Con-Con issues with the Oakland County AFL-CIO.

An earlier invitation to participate in an open hearing in Pontiac with GOP nominees was ignored by the AFL-CIO, said county GOP Chairman Arthur G. Elliott Jr. He urged the group to sit on a similar meeting at the Royal Oak YMCA, Tuesday.

IN A LETTER to county AFL-CIO president Fred V. Haggard, Elliott said GOP candidates "are deeply interested in learning the views of all segments of our society, and one of their foremost concerns is the opinion of organized labor on major constitutional matters."

Elliott also made it clear that GOP candidates are willing to meet with labor leaders "at any time or any place."

ALTHOUGH we do not know whether your organization plans to interview Con-Con candidates, we should like you to know that all Republican candidates would be happy to meet with your organization and state their views at any time or any place you specify, allowing, of course, sufficient notice," Elliott said.

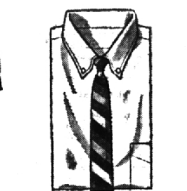
