FORMED IN 1960 at the United Assembly in Columbia, Mo., the fellowship is the first united campus Christian movement in the U. S. It brings together four communities: The United Church of Christ, International Convention of Christian Churches (Disciples of Christ), United Presbyterian Church, and Evangelical United Brethren Church.

The fellowship, participated in by students, faculty and campus ministers, is functioning on the campuses of more than 500 public and private non-church-related colleges as well as 65 church-related schools of higher education.

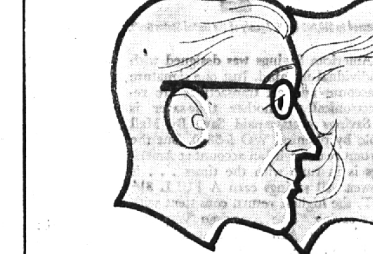

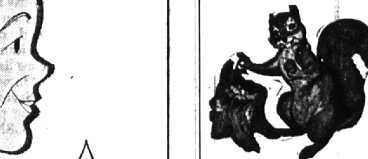
