

### Six Boy Scouts Plan Visit to Lincoln Trails

Months ago Boy Scouts of Lincoln school Troop 1034 were given a special assignment by scoutmaster George Cromer of Derby road, involving 10-mile hikes, semi-monthly reading and reporting on a book on Abraham Lincoln. Reward will be a trek through Lincoln Trails at Springfield, Ill. over the Labor Day weekend.

### Justice Kelly Receives Post

State Supreme Court Justice Harry F. Kelly, 413 N. Eton, Birmingham, was recently elected vice president and a trustee of a newly formed non-profit foundation for the advancement of education and charitable endeavors.

Known as the Alvin M. Bentley Foundation, it was established "to receive and administer funds for science, education and charitable projects."

The foundation will be administered by a board of trustees who are prominent in the fields of education, business, finance, the judiciary and law, in addition to Mr. and Mrs. Bentley.

BENTLEY SAID HE will make available to the Foundation a minimum of \$1,000,000 during the next

charitable, educational and religious institutions, and it would seem to me that all matters of that kind might be channeled through the Foundation."

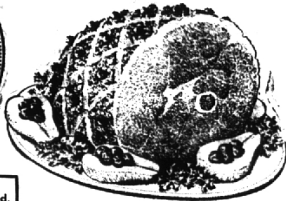
