

Leahy, Adams Possible GOP Chairman Choice

Names of a Birmingham and Bloomfield Hills man are included on a list of people being considered by a special committee as successor to Oakland County Republican Chairman Arthur G. Elliott, Jr.

They are: S. F. Leahy, 500 Hupp Cross Road, Birmingham, vice president of Detroit Edison Co.; Thomas R. Adams, 211 W. Harbale, Bloomfield Hills, president of Campbell-Ewald.

The committee, headed by James F. Preish, member of the GOP State Central Committee from Royal Oak, is not revealing the names of all possible selections but has verified that Adams and Leahy are included.

ELLIOTT IS retiring as chairman. He is a candidate for Constitution National Convention delegate from the Fifth Legislative District.

Leahy reportedly is "interested" in the job, while Adams was reported as "flattered but unavailable."

The committee is expected to submit to the party's executive committee sometime this week a list of winning, available candidates.

Final decision on a successor will be made by the executive committee, which consists of the party's nominees for state and county offices and their appointees.

MSUO Co-Sponsors Management Study

Michigan State University Oakland, in cooperation with the Small Business Administration, will conduct a management development seminar this fall for the owners and managers of small businesses.

In planning this program, an attempt was made to determine the management areas in which small businesses need the most help.

Dr. William E. Rhode, assistant director of Continuing Education, said the program will cover such phases of small business management as planning and organization, implementation of plans, financing, and marketing, legal principles, taxation, recordkeeping, labor relations and industrial purchasing.

EACH SUBJECT will be covered in a two-and-one-half hour session on Tuesday evenings. A specialist in each field will lecture on the subject.

The 10 - week program starts Sept. 26 at 7:30 p.m. The eleventh and final session will feature a graduation banquet and a special awards program.

Enrollment is limited to the first 30 registrants.

THE SMALL business management development program was launched by the Office of Continuing Education at Michigan State University Oakland, in the Spring of 1954. On a nation-wide basis, over 30,000 small businessmen have attended 1,137 SBA co-sponsored courses conducted by 350 educational institutions.
