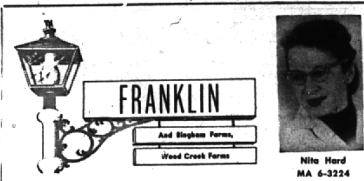

Van Dusen Asks To Erase State's 'Negative Image'

SOUTHFIELD—Richard C. Van Dusen, fourth district GOP Con-con nominee, today urged the forthcoming constitutional convention to "rise above partisanship and erase Michigan's negative national image."

CON-CON, Van Dusen asserted, can stamp out this unfavorable impression by "eliminating sedulously motivated earmarking of funds and other constitutional limitations that have helped create our fiscal crises."

"We can re-install in Michigan citizens a new unity of purpose and pride in their state," he added.

THE 36-YEAR-OLD attorney also urged his audience "not to overlook the opportunities for progress frequently overshadowed by major con-con issues."

Sungling out local government and elections, Van Dusen called for "broadening of the home-rule

concept to permit local units of government to become more effective servants of the people."

Van Dusen also urged "a consistent annual election day, perhaps the first Tuesday in November," as a positive step in reducing "voter apathy and fatigue."

"The average citizen is overwhelmed and confused by a proliferation of elections which come along every few months without rhyme or reason," Van Dusen said. "A consistent annual election day would eliminate much of this."

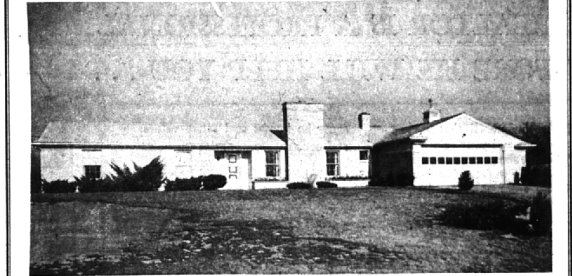

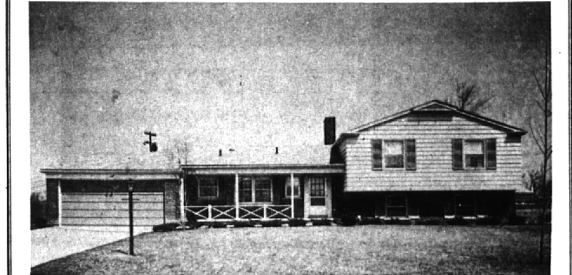

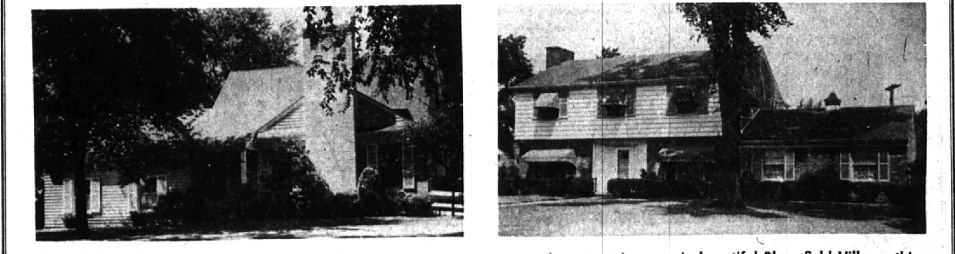
