Water Service On Haynes St. Slowed by Break

Water service to about 30 to 40 Birmingham residences was affected Monday night and Tuesday morning when an eight-inch main broke on Haynes, just east of Haynes Court.

Service was resumed about 11:30 a.m. Tuesday.

Water service was interrupted on Haynes Street, between Torry and Bowers, DPW Superintendent Thomas Brien said. Two gates were shut down and pressure partially reduced overnight, allowing residents some water, pending repairs.

The break was reported by a resident at 5 p.m. Monday. Brien said water was seeping from under the pavement for a distance of 50 to 100 feet from the break. The actual break was located through listening devices early Monday evening.

WORK was delayed until Tuesday morning, Brien said, because noise of jackhammers would have disturbed neighbors if undertaken during the night.

Brien said the trouble was caused by a sheared line. Such a break is rare in the summer, Brien noted, and could have been caused by ground settling and thus removing some of the support from the line.

Wet ground conditions, due to recent heavy rains, could have contributed to such a condition, Brien said.

Basic Seamanship Course Offered

United States Coast Guard Auxiliary basic seamanship and small boat handling course will be offered in the Birmingham area. The 10-week course will start Sept. 21 at Southfield High School, 24274 Labor Road and Sept. 26 at Michigan Community House, 380 S. Bates.

CLASSES will be from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m. with eight lecture and one review class and final examination on tenth night. There is no charge for instruction. A nominal fee will be charged for class book and supplies furnished.

Course consists of practical language and boat construction, seamanship, aids to navigation, charts and compass, rules of the road, knots and splices, boating courtesy and safety regulations.

Paving, Rink Contracts Let

Birmingham city commissioners awarded a contract Monday night for construction of concrete pavement on Oak St. between Lakepark and Lakeside.

They accepted the low bid of \$985,800 from Mike Harabedian, Inc., Troy.

The project calls for a 45-foot wide pavement with integral curb, approaches to the new Oak St. bridge and a new sidewalk on the south side of Oak between the two streets.

Scheduled completion date for the paving is Oct. 28.

COMMISSIONERS also awarded a contract for maintenance of refrigeration equipment at the Eton Park skating rink for the forthcoming season.

Main, Page Serve As Representatives To League Meeting

Birmingham City Commissioner Ralph A. Main and Robert Page were appointed by the commission Monday night as delegate and alternate, respectively, to the forthcoming annual meeting of Michigan Municipal League.

The conference will take place Sept. 14-16 on Mackinac Island. One of the main topics of interest will be a report from the League's Con-Con committee on its suggestions for municipalities to ponder in connection with the state Constitutional Convention.

Plans Near Completion For 4 Tennis Courts

Birmingham's engineering department is completing plans for construction of four new tennis courts.

City Engineer William T. Killen said he hopes construction will be completed this fall, so the courts would be ready for play early next spring.

Two courts will be built in Crestview Park on the east side of Southfield between Northland and Southland.

Two others will be built in the so-called Lincoln Well site on the south side of Lincoln between Larchlea and Arden Lane.

"WE ANTICIPATE submitting construction plans and cost estimates to the city commission in the next couple of weeks," Killen stated.

Actually, four tennis courts are planned at each site, the engineer related, but only two will be constructed at each at this time.

"All of the courts will be above minimum standards," he stated.

City Commissioner William H. Burgum, who is a member of the city recreation board, said Monday night he hopes every effort will be made to award contracts so the courts can be completed this year.

He said a need for more tennis courts exists and said he believes contract costs will be lower this year than next.

Operation Hours For Signals Told

Hours of operation of the school traffic signals on Maple near Baldwin were approved by Birmingham city commissioners Monday night.

As proposed by Police Chief Ralph W. Mosley, the signals will be in operation from 7:30 a.m. through 9 a.m.; 11:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m.; 2:45 p.m.-3:45 p.m.
