**THE BAG** and possession limit for coots is six, a cutback from last year's quota of six per day and 12 in possession. Coot hunting will run concurrently with the duck season.

Except for a noon starting time on opening day, shooting hours on all migratory birds will be shortened, running from sunrise to sunset. In 1960, hunting time began one-half hour before sunrise.

Restrictions in the duck season are more stringent than Conservation Department game men had anticipated.

However, since spring, drought reports from the Canadian prairies have told of the worst breeding ground conditions for ducks in 30 years.

The Mississippi flyway, which includes Michigan, normally depends on these prairies for about 50 per cent of its ducks.

**Pheasant Broods In 10% Decline, Survey Reveals**

Michigan's bird hunters can look for more action from ruffed grouse and woodcock this fall, but their pheasant shooting success may take a slight dip from last year.

Results of the Conservation Department's annual summer mail carrier survey show a 10 per cent decline in pheasant broods seen this year in Southern Michigan.

Department game men feel, however, that brood counts were partly toned down by extremely heavy cover during the July 24-Aug. 5 survey.

About 85 per cent of this year's wheat crop was still standing when the survey ended; in 1960, approximately 75 per cent had been harvested by that time.

Allowing for this, the department estimates hunters may take upwards of 350,000 pheasants this fall. Last year, the kill was about 375,000 birds.

MAIL CARRIER counts indicate pheasant production was down some 20 per cent from last spring in the Thumb area and Southeastern Michigan.

In Allegan and Ottawa counties, it fell about 14 per cent. Carriers noted a 40 per cent increase in brood numbers in Southwestern Michigan.

Their fallies for the central sector of the pheasant range were essentially the same as in 1960.

Kingcock production jumped nearly 100 per cent in the northern fringe area of the state's pheasant country—Adair, Ottawa, Mecosta, Lake, and Newago counties—according to limited observations made there.

And even the Lions recently acquired a veteran tackle, John Gonzaga, from Dallas, to strengthen the front wall for an expected tie bid.
