Policy Owners Receive Dividends

Policy owners of New York Life Insurance Co. will receive record total dividends of \$136,250,000 in 1962 compared with the \$122,400,000 payable in 1961, Gilbert S. Morton, general manager of the company's Bloomfield-Detroit General Office, has announced.
