Persons interested in enlisting in the U. S. Army from the Birmingham area may report to the Birmingham municipal building room 197, every Friday from noon until 4 p.m. Sgt. Robert Brottenmark, U. S. Army recruiter, will be in attendance.

The following career fields will be available during the month of December for personnel enlisting. All army enlistments are for a three-year period.

Personnel enlisting may choose one of the following fields: combat engineers, armor, field artillery, radio and carrier repair, field communications, telephone outside plant maintenance, ammunition, utilities, auxiliary services, supply, automotive maintenance, motor transportation, administration, communications, general supply, parts supply, medical care and treatment and food service, military police.

In addition personnel may enlist for the U. S. Army Security Agency, Far East, Europe, Hawaii or Alaska.

**Navy Reserve Unit Wins State Honor**

A Naval Reserve unit commanded by Lt. Cmdr. Walter J. Post, 650 Henrietta, Birmingham, has been named for state honor.

Naval Reserve Surface Division 9-104(L) stationed at the Naval Reserve Training Center in Pontiac will receive the Captain R. T. Brodhead Memorial Trophy for scoring the highest among Michigan units in the national Forestry Trophy competition.

The trophy, awarded annually by the VFW, will be presented at 7 p.m. Dec. 13 at the Pontiac Training Center.

THE PONTIAC UNIT scored first among the 12 units in the state and ranked fifth among the 49 units comprising the 9th Naval District Forestry competition program.

Announcement of the award was made by VFW Naval Affairs Committee Chairman A. J. Kunert and Cmdr. William C. Remick, Naval Reserve Training Center Commander in Pontiac.

A legal wrinkle, in order to more adequately enforce the City's parking meter ordinance, was ironed out by the City Commission Monday night, when it passed an amendment to both the traffic and parking ordinances. The amendments make the automobile registration plate prima facie evidence of a violation and makes the registered owner—although he may not be the driver—subject to arrest as having committed the violation.

Paul Neal Averill, business manager of The Birmingham Eccentric, will be chairman of the Birmingham men's organization in the county division of the Woodward General Hospital Building Fund Campaign. Averill's acceptance of the campaign post was announced by H. H. Gardner of Birmingham, chairman of the county division's men's team.

Opening of a new street, midway between Raymide and Oak, and extending from Lakeside east to Woodward and Hunter avenues, was ordered by City Manager Donald C. Egbert Monday night as the most logical solution to establishing an access street to property owners in the northwest section of the city.
