**WSU to Honor Pierrot Dec. 12**

George F. Pierrot, well-known for his travel-adventure programs on television, will be honored at Wayne State University's annual observance of Journalism Day, Tuesday, Dec. 12.

Pierrot will be presented the university's Distinguished Service Award by WSU President Dr. Clarence B. Hilberry for his contributions to the life of Detroit.

The ceremony will be held at the Community Arts Auditorium at 2 p.m. Pierrot will then give the principal Journalism Day address.

His lecture on "Electronic Journalism" will deal with the future of travel-educational-documentary presentations in the electronic media.

PIERROT, president and managing director of World Adventure Series, was selected for the award for the cultural enrichment the series has brought to Michigan television viewers, but also for less known public activities.

The World Adventure Series began in 1933, primarily as a move to save the educational department and public services of the Detroit Institute of Arts.

Wayne State's Journalism curriculum and department were set up as the result of one of the many donations made by the series.

DURING World War II, Pierrot organized and was managing director of Detroit's United Service Organizations. He was executive secretary of the Wayne University Medical Science Center project from 1943 to 1947.

Before coming to Detroit, Pierrot was a newspaper reporter, magazine writer and publicist in Washington. He graduated from the University of Washington in 1930 and he taught journalism there for a short time.

**City or County?**

**Which Comes First?**

Do Birmingham's representatives on the county board of supervisors represent the city or the county?

City commissioners debated this issue Monday night.

When he sits as a commissioner, he hears his thinking toward the City, said Carl Ingraham.

When he sits as a supervisor, he is "thinking as the county, not Birmingham."

THE DISCUSSION came up as a result of an inquiry from City Manager L. R. Gare relative to a meeting today of the Legislative Committee of the Oakland County Board of Supervisors.

Gare was invited to the meeting to discuss Birmingham's request for action leading to tax exemption for fallout shelters.

Inasmuch as Commissioner Ingraham is a member of the Legislative Committee, said Gare, "I would like instruction as to whether the City Commission wishes me to attend this meeting or would prefer that Mr. Ingraham represent the City."

"I think you should," said Ingraham, "or someone, to present the commission's point of view. I will be thinking as the county, not Birmingham."

"YOU MEAN," asked Mayor Florence H. Willett, "you're not concerned with Birmingham?"

"When I sit on the board, I am sitting as a representative of the county," Ingraham replied.

Commissioner Robert Page said he thought the reason the commission named a member to the board of supervisors was to have someone to represent the City.

"When you sit on the board, you represent the county," said Commissioner Ralph Main, a former supervisor.

"I think it would be well for Mr. Gare to sit in on these discussions," the mayor then stated. It was agreed that he would.

AS FOR the possible tax exemption, consensus was that a maximum figure be set, that there should be a standard exemption, that dual-purpose shelters should be included and that the precise formula should be developed by the board of supervisors.

**Chairman of WSU Psychiatry Dept.**

Dr. Jacques S. Gottlieb, of Bloomfield Hills, has been appointed chairman of the department of psychiatry in the college of medicine at Wayne State University.

The announcement was made by Dr. Gordon H. Scott, vice president for medical college development of WSU.

Dr. Gottlieb and his wife, Helen, live at 7711 Fairhill Road. They have three children.

SCOTT SAID Dr. Gottlieb will take over his new duties immediately. Dr. Gottlieb succeeds Dr. John Dorsey, who was named university professor in 1960.

In addition to his duties as chairman of the department of psychiatry, Dr. Gottlieb will retain his duties as director of the Lafayette Clinic.

A native of Trinidad, Colo., Dr. Gottlieb received his B.S. and M.D. degrees from Harvard University. From 1936 to 1953 he was a member of the staff of the Iowa State Psychopathic Hospital and of the faculty of the State University of Iowa.

From 1953 to 1955 he was director of the institution, Jackson Memorial Hospital, Miami, Fla., and chairman of the department of psychiatry at the University of Miami.

SINCE 1955 Dr. Gottlieb has been professor of psychiatry at Wayne State and director of Lafayette Clinic.

Dr. Gottlieb is a member of the Council of American Psychiatric Association; a director of the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology, Inc., and president-elect of the Michigan Society of Neurology and Psychiatry. He has also authored more than 90 articles in medical and professional journals on the results of his research.
