United Fund To Recognize 700 Leaders

More than 700 united campaign leaders from Michigan are expected to attend the Campaign Achievement Celebration of the Michigan United Fund at the Lansing Civic Center Tuesday.

The celebration is an annual event recognizing the volunteer effort of community leaders throughout Michigan in raising funds the united way to meet the needs of voluntary health and welfare agencies and recognizing the thousands of volunteers who serve on local united funds.

The Michigan United Fund, which annually holds the Campaign Achievement Celebration, is the fund-raising organization for 35 state and national health and welfare agencies, such as the Michigan Heart Association, United Cerebral Palsy Association of Michigan, USO, Michigan Association for Better Hearing, Michigan Epilepsy Center & Association, Arthritis and Rheumatism Foundation, Roscoe B. Jackson Memorial Laboratory, and 28 other state and national agencies. Funds to support these agencies are contributed by each local united campaign which includes the Michigan United Fund as a partner in its local drive.

PRINCIPAL SPEAKER at the meeting will be Theodore R. McKelvin, leading united fund volunteer in his home city of Baltimore and former mayor of Baltimore and governor of Maryland. Jack F. Wolfman, vice president of General Motors and general manager of the Oldsmobile Division, and president of the Michigan United Fund, called the meeting "a salute to the hard working volunteers that each year accept the challenge of raising the necessary funds to support the voluntary agencies that are so much a part of our American way of life."

Campaign chairmen from the 196 individual united campaigns in Michigan will receive the "Golden U Award," an honor reserved for those volunteers who have led the united effort in their community. The meeting will be sponsored by Fisher Body Division of General Motors Corp. as a tribute to the volunteer united campaigners in Michigan.
