This year the student council, under the direction of Mr. Keller, is going to promote the sending of Christmas baskets to the needy. Each homeroom is preparing a basket.

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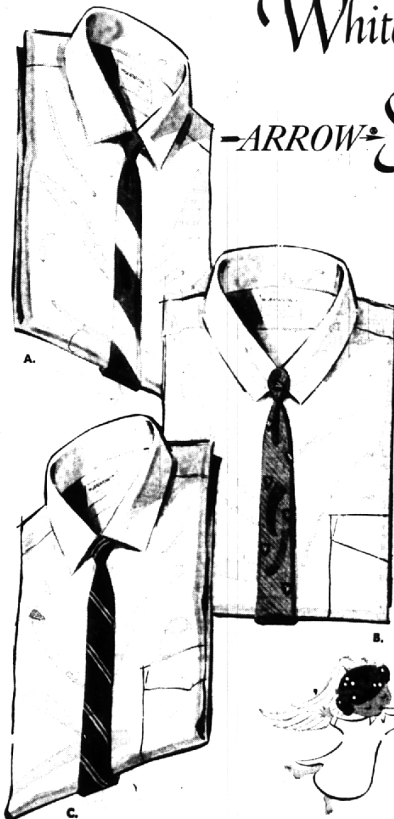
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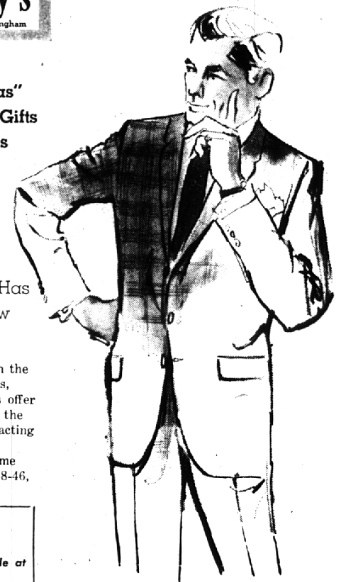
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
