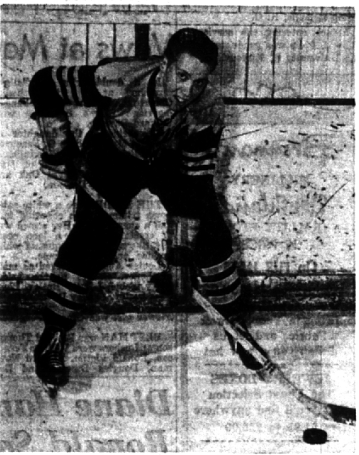
Con-Con Report

LANSING—Friday sessions at the Constitutional Convention began last week and Stephen S. Nisbet, convention president, told the delegates they can expect Friday morning sessions from now on until the convention concludes its work, probably near the latter part of March.
 Delegates generally agree on the importance of concluding their work before April 1, 1962, following Attorney General Paul Adams' ruling that the new Constitution must be ready by that date in order to be submitted to the electorate at the November general election.
 Adams' ruling indicates that adjournment of the convention later than April 1 would prohibit the Constitution getting on the ballot before April, 1963.
THE LOCAL Government Council has scheduled public hearings on issues that should be of interest to many citizens. Discussions on township status have been set for Dec. 12 at 10:30 a.m.; counties, Dec. 12 at 8:30 a.m.; cities, Dec. 12 at 8 p.m.; metropolitan areas, Dec. 19 at 10:30 a.m.; and general discussions, Dec. 19 and 20 at 7:30 p.m. If need arises, evening meetings will also be scheduled on Dec. 12, 13 and 14.
CON-CON IS making history in Boston. Houghton, Mifflin Co. has contacted the convention for information and photographs on Con-Con activities. The editor of this publishing house plan to include data on the convention in its history textbook.
 The clergy from nearby churches of all faiths have been attending to the prayers that open each general session of the convention. However, each Monday evening session hereafter will see a delegate give the prayer, until all who wish to do so have been accommodated. Guest ministers will continue to fill the role at other sessions during the week.
FORMER U. S. Senator President M. Brown evoked interest from members of the Finance and Taxation Committee when he testified that \$1,000,000 a year in interest could be saved if Michigan's full credit were put behind state revenue and bond issues.
 D. Hale Bae (R) of Stanton, chairman of the committee, indicated it might be difficult to get Michigan voters to bond themselves for an amount sufficient to retire all the outstanding revenue bonds.
 Brown, chairman of the Mackinac Bridge Authority, emphasized that the Mackinac Bridge was not in financial or physical difficulties. He said the convention might authorize the use of state full faith and credit bonds now, but the bridge bonds should be left alone until 1964.
 He proposed that revenue bonds be retired and replaced by full state-supported bonds whenever the legislature finds an issue is "adequately financed" and there is no chance a drain on the state general fund is in sight.

 District Four of the Michigan School Band and Orchestra Association (department of the state) has selected its sites and dates for the various instrumental music festivals to be held during the current school year.
 District Four includes the counties of Macomb and Oakland and has Burton Bronson, 1779 Pontiac, Birmingham, as its corresponding secretary.
 Feb. 10—Solo and Ensemble Festival at Troy High School.
 Feb. 24—Orchestra Festival at Fraser High School.
 Feb. 24—Band Festival at Dondero High School (Class A Sr. High; Class AA, A, Jr. High).
 March 3—Band Festival at Troy High School (Class AA, B, C, Sr. High; Class B, C, Jr. High).
THE FESTIVALS, which are held annually at this time of the year throughout the state, have the following purposes:
 1. To stimulate interest in the study of band and orchestra instruments.
 2. To develop a desire for good music.
 3. To cultivate worth-while leisure time activities and interests among boys and girls.
 4. To help promote the recognition and status of instrumental music as a curricular subject.
 5. To help develop in each community an instrumental music unit which shall serve as a vital force in bringing people into closer relationship with schools.
 Several thousand school musicians participate in the festivals each year. Winners of first division honors qualify for the state festivals later in the season.
