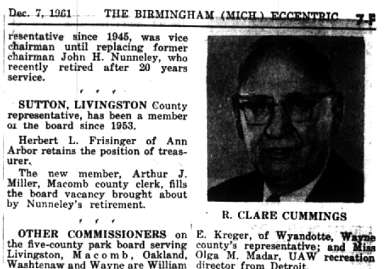
"HOW COULD any woman put out the light in her Man's eyes while he's checking on the condition of her wardrobe" in

## WSU Honors B'ham Woman

A Birmingham woman and a French painter were honored for their contributions to the field of art in special ceremonies at Wayne State University's Community Arts Auditorium Nov. 29.  
Lydia Kahn Winston, 1265 Lakeside, Birmingham, and Marcel Duchamp received Doctor of Humane Letters degrees conferred by Dr. Clarence B. Hillberry, president of Wayne State.  
Mrs. Winston, daughter of the late celebrated architect Albert Kahn, is known locally, nationally and abroad for her collection of modern art.

EDUCATED at the Liggett School, Vassar College and the Cranbrook Academy of Art, she is a trustee of Bennington College; a trustee of the Art Founders Society of the Detroit Institute of Arts and a director of the International Council of the Museum of Modern Art in New York.  
She was honored, in part, for spending her time and energy to share her art treasures with teachers, critics, students and museum people from all parts of the United States and the world.  
Mrs. Winston played a key role in bringing the Futurist Exhibition to Detroit, currently being shown at the Detroit Institute of Arts.

SEVENTY-FOUR-year old Duchamp, father of the contemporary art movement and painter of the famous "Nude Descending a Staircase," was recognized for his significant role in shaping our heritage in the arts.  
A native of France, he currently lives in New York City.

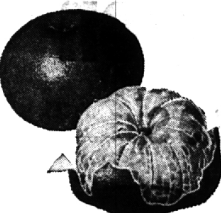
