3 Freeway Miles To Open Dec. 21

The first section of the \$40 million Southfield Freeway in Detroit will be opened to traffic Dec. 21. State Highway Commissioner John C. Mackie said nearly three miles of the six-lane freeway, on Detroit's west side, will be opened. Another mile of the Southfield Freeway is scheduled to be open to traffic in January.

Mackie said the two sections of freeway will ease traffic congestion on Southfield and enable motorists using the route to make better time. A little more than half of the Southfield Freeway is now under construction.

Ban Private Signs On Rights-of-Way

Between 15,000 and 20,000 private signs located within the public right-of-way of state highways are being removed under an enforcement program started by the Michigan State Highway Department.

Letters have gone state-wide to businesses and organizations asking removal of signs that trespass on public property.

State Highway Commissioner John C. Mackie said the ban on private signs in public right-of-way is required by state law and federal regulations.

"THE RESPONSE so far has been mostly favorable and there is every indication the vast majority of sign owners will comply," Mackie said.

"It is not fair to one business for another to have the competitive advantage of a sign on the right-of-way.

"If we let everybody put up a sign without any restraint, our highways would soon be jungles of competing signs.

"The only way to be fair to everyone is to remove all signs," Mackie said.

"MANY OF THESE signs are a traffic hazard, distracting the motorist or hampering his view."

The Highway Department can institute court action against those who do not comply with the ban. Department spokesmen said, however, they believe this action will be unnecessary.

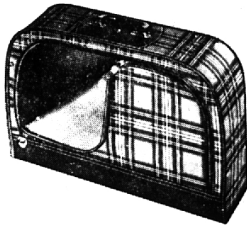

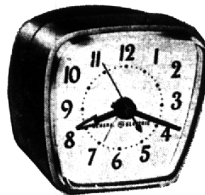

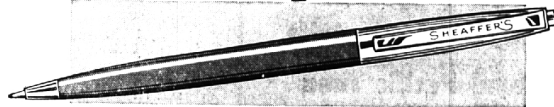
