## New Attendance Records Set at Kensington Park

Kenneth L. Hallenbeck, director of the Huron-Clinton Metropolitan Authority, announced this week that two new attendance records were established for the month of November at Kensington Metropolitan Park southeast of Brighton. Over 51,400 persons visited the park during November this year as compared to 50,000 in 1960; 43,000 in 1959; 38,000 in 1958 and 30,000 in November, 1957.

The park's Nature Center, a museum of natural science featuring several seasonal exhibits, was visited by over 6,700 persons during November, 1961, compared to just over 4,000 last November. The Nature Center is open for public viewing from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday and Sunday and from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. weekdays.

OVER 13,000 persons participated in the nature program during November, which included guided field trips, lectures to civic groups, lectures at schools in the counties of Oakland, Livingston, Macomb, Washington and Wayne, conservation projects and the 5,700 visitors to the Nature Center.

While no figures are available, each season the nature trails are getting increased usage by individual and family groups that hike along trails despite the cold weather in November and other months.
