AAUW Group to Discuss Mentally Ill Children

Friday is the date scheduled by the Michigan division of the American Association of University Women for a public hearing on the facilities for the care of mentally ill children. It will be held 1:30 p.m. in the Wayne County Youth Home, 1025 E. Forest, Detroit.

Mrs. Edward F. Lalup Jr. of the AAUW state legislative committee will chair the investigation. Mrs. Marvin R. Marsh of the Birmingham Branch of AAUW will aid in this presentation, along with other members of the state board.

ONE OF THE key witnesses in the afternoon will be Senator Farrell Roberts, who will introduce the AAUW bills into the legislature. They seek the provision of separate children's units and the funds for improved care and treatment for children already hospitalized.

Other witnesses, who will describe the plight of over 500 children in the state hospitals for the mentally ill are the Honorable James H. Lincoln, Probate Judge of Wayne County Juvenile Court; Dr. James Graves, Michigan Mental Health Commissioner; Mrs. Donald Tracy of the United Church Women of Michigan; Mrs. Grosvenor N. Grimes, Detroit Commission on Children and Youth; Mrs. Louis Colombo Jr. of the Foundation for Emotionally Disturbed Children; Mrs. Leadora Winkler of the Detroit Section, National Council of Jewish Women; Sister Mary, director of Marygrove Psychological Clinic and the Honorable Lucille McCollough of the state House of Representatives.

THE PUBLIC hearing is planned to bring the story of the existing conditions in state hospitals to the people so they in turn might convey their wishes to their legislators.

Most children, with the exception of those at Mary Muff Facility at Kalamazoo, are housed with adults and receive only a minimum amount of education and specialized treatment.
