

Lathrup Announces Recreation Program

The mid-winter program sponsored by Lathrup Recreation Commission has been announced. French two will be offered at Lathrup School on Tuesdays and Thursdays afternoons at 8:45, beginning Jan. 23, 1962. Registration deadline is Jan. 18.

Beginning Spanish will be offered at Birney School, Tuesdays and Fridays at 3:45 p.m. for children in the third grade or older. Classes begin Jan. 9 with a Jan. 8 deadline for registration.

ART CLASSES, all at 3:45 p.m. will be offered at Lathrup School on Thursdays beginning Jan. 11 and at Birney School on Tuesdays beginning Jan. 16. Fundamentals of art for third grade or older children will be offered at

Birney on Wednesdays, starting Jan. 17. Final registration is Jan. 8 for all three art courses. Jan. 17 is opening day for charm school for women to be held Wednesdays at 8:30 p.m. at Lathrup School with registration closed Jan. 8.

Classes in beginning square dancing will be held on Wednesdays at 8 p.m. at Northbrook School from Jan. 17 on. Advanced square dancers may take lessons at Birney School on Tuesdays at 8 p.m., starting Jan. 16. Deadline for registration for square dancing classes is Jan. 10. A fee will be charged for the two dancing classes and the charm school.

LITTLE BOYS and girls may take gym, if they are in second or

third grades, on Wednesday at 8:45 p.m. at Lathrup School. Gym for boys and men will be held Thursday evenings at Lathrup School. Hours are 7:30 for boys of junior high age and up; 8:30 for men. This facility will begin on Jan. 4.

A Saturday recreation program, in cooperation with Southfield Parks and recreation, will be held Saturdays. Gym for boys will be held from 9 until 11 a.m. for girls from 11 a.m. until noon. Recreational crafts are offered from 9 a.m. to noon with a small charge for each session.

THIS SATURDAY program will be held at Lathrup and Northbrook Schools. Boys' basketball will be played

Thursdays at 7:30 p.m. and Saturdays at 10 a.m. at Lathrup School. Senior citizens of Lathrup who are interested in starting a club were asked, in the recreation commission's program announcement, to contact Dave Redwood, 17671 San Rosa.

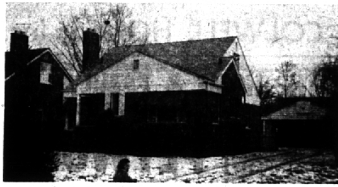

Lathrup Residents Given Breakdown Of Tax Payments

LATHRUP—A breakdown of taxes paid by Lathrup residents was provided in the city's latest newsletter. Only 17.7 per cent of 1961-62 taxes goes to the city, with the 1961 tax rate remaining at \$7.50

per thousand of assessed valuation for city operation. Collected in July, this is the only city tax. RECENTLY RECEIVED tax bills are the county and school tax statements, the latter stated. An increase in rate from last year's total rate of \$50.88 to the current \$52 per thousand of assessed valuation is due to an adjustment in equalized valuations. These taxes are collected by the city and turned over to the county and schools. Of the \$52, \$11.42 goes to the county; \$40.58 to the schools. DEBT RETIREMENT tax rates vary according to bond payments required. \$1.30 is for Evergreen Interceptor and \$1.10 to storm water drain bond retirement, all payable in July.

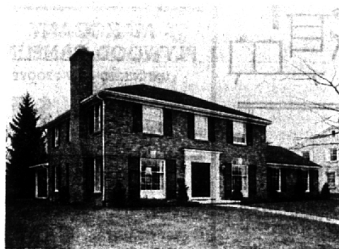

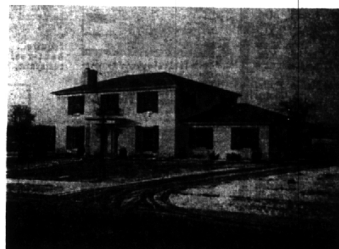
