W. H. Mack Appointed MIBF Group Chairman

Donald F. Valley, general chairman of the Michigan Industrial Building Fund (MIBF) group, has appointed W. H. Mack as chairman of the group.

Mack, who is executive vice president of the Michigan Wisconsin Pipe Line Co. and the American Louisiana Pipe Line Co., will be responsible for building an organization of volunteers to solicit funds from some 1,000 small and medium business firms in the tri-county area.

Hospital projects which will benefit from the MIBF drive in this area are the relocation of the New Providence Hospital to Southfield and the addition of facilities to provide 235 beds at William Beaumont Hospital.

IN ACCEPTING the appointment, Mack explained that the MIBF group is actually a continuation of the building fund drive which officially started last summer and had been interrupted in order that the annual Torch Drive could be conducted during its normal time period.

He pointed out that a large portion of the 1961-62 objective of \$1,000,000 has already been subscribed through gifts from major corporations earlier this year.

"The rapid growth and contribution of population during the last decade has made it extremely difficult, and in many cases impossible, for local health facilities to keep pace with increased needs and demands," Mack said.

"The MIBF will provide up to 40 per cent of the approximate \$30,000,000 cost of approved hospital projects, with the institution's share remaining for the remaining 60 per cent."

He said the MIBF goal, together with the funds supplied by the hospital participating hospitals and agencies from their own sources, will

provide 784 new hospital beds, the relocation of 480 other beds in new facilities, the replacement of 50 beds and the expansion and improvement of supporting services in seven existing hospitals and one new hospital.

A portion of the fund also will be allocated toward the purchase of property for the proposed Medical Center.

Following his appointment, Mack plans to name eight co-chairmen to serve with him, each of whom will be in charge of soliciting funds which will begin solicitation early in January.

Mack noted that all contributors subscribing in accordance with fair-share formulae being developed by the MIBF will be given immunity for a period of five years from further requests for capital funds by the participating hospitals or agencies.

Production Level Shows Decline For State Stork

As of the end of October, the number of births recorded in Michigan was only 64 more than the number reported in the same period a year ago—186,696 to 186,632.

It looked at mid-year as though a "bumper crop" was in the offing, when the cumulative statistics through July indicated the number of births were 2,592 over the 1960 figure.

However, output has declined steadily in the last three months compared to 1960 production and the substantial margin of the summer months has dwindled considerably.

LAST YEAR'S total was 193,858. In order to surpass this mark, Michigan will have to record 37,000 births in November and December—considerably more than the present monthly average of 15,000.

From 1947 on, the number of births increased steadily each year, reaching an all-time high of 208,488 in 1957 before dropping off.

On the other side of the ledger, there were 49,808 deaths recorded during the first nine months of the year—541 less than the number recorded during the same period in 1960.

Excluding immigration and migration, Michigan showed a net increase of 90,909 during the first three quarters of the year.

Over 90,000 grades are posted each semester by The University of Michigan Office of Registration and Records.
