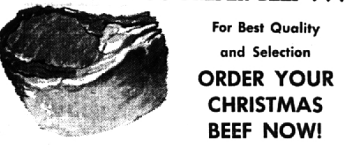

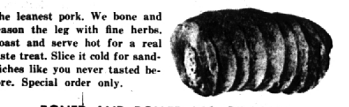

MSUO Address Follows Businessmen's Seminar

"Watch the economy and try to determine what industry or particular product is likely to gain wide acceptance in the near future. Then design your product." This was the advice given this week by Jim Robbins, president of the Jim Robbins Co. of Royal Oak, to a banquet of small businessmen who had completed a Small Business Management Seminar conducted this fall at Michigan State University Oakland.

The 10-week seminar co-sponsored by the University's Division of Continuing Education and the U.S. Small Business Administration, attracted 82 businessmen from Oakland, Wayne, and Macomb Counties.

"LOOK FOR GROWTH industries," Robbins stressed throughout his talk. "The successful small manufacturer needs to have the imagination and analytical ability to find himself on the ground floor of an accelerated growth industry." He termed imagination and determination the two necessary ingredients for profitable ventures. Robbins is the owner and founder of the Jim Robbins Co. which manufactures plastic injection moldings. Other wholly-owned subsidiaries and companies give him a group of diversified small businesses with annual net sales of 12-15 million dollars, and 1500 employees.

After reviewing a number of his company's plastic products, Robbins said that his company is spending more and more of its net income, often as much as 20 percent, on research and development of products and processes. He also claimed that investment abroad is profitable for the small businessman as well as for large corporations.

Senator Named President of Alemite Firm

John M. Senator, for the past six years director of sales of the Kent Moore Organization, Inc., Detroit service tool and equipment firm, has been elected president and director of the Alemite Company of Michigan.

The firm is a distributor of Alemite automotive and industrial lubrication and other products and of Stewart-Warner instruments, gauges and accessories. Senator, who is succeeding Thomas B. Anderson as president of the Alemite firm, joined Stewart-Warner in its Alemite Division as a sales representative in 1937 and was a factory representative in the Detroit office prior to joining Kent Moore in 1955.

He resides at 482 Tibbity in Birmingham, with Mrs. Senator and their two children, Janet and John.

Anderson has become chairman of the board after almost 38 years as president. The Andersons live at 800 Sunningdale Drive, Bloomfield Hills.

Harold Hill, an employee of the Alemite Company of Michigan for 12 years, most recently as a sales manager, was elected vice president. The Hills also reside in Birmingham, at 1786 Haynes.

Bureau Starts Study Of Drivers' Control

The Bureau of Public Roads is launching a study, under laboratory conditions, to measure general driver ability to steer a car in the traffic stream, while simultaneously searching for specific location signs. Actual driving conditions will be simulated by a relatively simple device training on simulated landings.

In this experiment, the driver will sit in front of an oscilloscope, an electronic screen like a television picture tube, representing the road ahead. A spot of light, indicating the position of the vehicle, will move horizontally across the oscilloscope.

THE DRIVER will try to keep the point of light centered in the scope by manipulating a control so as to compensate for the movement of the light. (This control resembles a small steering wheel with a handle mounted on the rim and is operated by a cranking action.)

The task is similar to the performance of a driver in keeping his vehicle properly positioned in the traffic stream of a winding road.

When the driver is sufficiently familiar with this procedure to stay on the beam, a motion picture will be projected on a screen behind the oscilloscope, creating the illusion of moving along a highway. The driver will see signs as he approaches and passes them. These signs will carry fictitious names of various cities and towns. The driver will be instructed to watch for signs bearing a specific name and to depress a foot pedal as soon as he spots the right sign.

THE STUDY is designed to determine general driver ability to maintain adequate control over the vehicle while simultaneously searching for a specific sign, and to measure the time sharing basis employed by the vehicle operator in performing the two tasks.

This is an initial research attempt in the highway field to study the interaction of these two common driver tasks. This program and safely under highly controlled conditions in the laboratory, but may well lead to field tests in the future.
