**1961 Low Reported for Areas With Large Unemployment**

WASHINGTON, D. C. — The number of major areas with substantial unemployment classifications dropped to the lowest level of the year during November, the U. S. Labor Department has announced.

Sixty areas were in this category, 8 fewer than in October and 41 below the all-time high of 101 in March and April of 1951.

According to the monthly survey of 150 major areas by the Bureau of Employment Security and its affiliated state agencies, in November, 1960, 51 major areas had substantial unemployment.

A total of nine major areas were reclassified during November, all to categories indicating lower unemployment and improved labor market outlook.

This was in sharp contrast to November a year ago when there were 19 major area classification changes, with all of the revisions indicating increased unemployment.

**THE NOVEMBER** report listed eight major areas as moving from a group D (substantial unemployment ranging from 8 to 8.9 percent) to a moderate unemployment group (9 to 8.9 percent unemployment): Tampa-St. Petersburg, Fla.; Savannah, Ga.; Worcester, Mass.; Saginaw, Mich.; New Brunswick-Perth Amboy, N. J.; Akron, O.; Tulsa, Okla.; and Corpus Christi, Tex.

One area, Rochester, N.Y., was reclassified from group C to low unemployment group B (usual unemployment rate—1.5 to 2.9 percent).

The bureau each month groups

the 150 major areas into six major labor supply categories according to the extent of unemployment and other major labor market factors.

Classification groupings are designated by letters ranging from A to F, with group A reflecting overall labor shortages, and group F the highest unemployment rates. Areas are placed in D, E or F if they have substantial unemployment.

**IN ADDITION** to the major area area classifications, three smaller areas were added to the "substantial unemployment" list: Elizabethtown, Ky.; Hammond, La.; and Greenville, Tenn.

Six other areas were removed as a result of improved local employment conditions: Florence-Southfield, Ala.; Hattiesburg, Miss.; Pascagoula, Miss.; Morgantown, N. C.; Rossmore Rapids, N. C.; Brentwood, Wash.

Two smaller areas — Mount Carmel-Olney, Ill., and Marchessault, Ky. — were subdivided into five "very small" areas to reflect changes in worker commitment and so removed from the "smaller areas" list.

The net effect of all these changes was to decrease the number of areas so classified to 201 in November, as compared with 206 in October and 217 in September. In November a year ago, some 123 areas were classified as "moderate unemployment" areas of substantial unemployment.

**State Motorists Driving Faster, Survey Reveals**

Motorists are driving nearly three miles an hour faster in Michigan this year than they were at this time last year, the State Highway Dept. has reported.

State Highway Commissioner John C. Mackie said the average speed of passenger cars on all state

highways is 58 miles an hour during the day and faster than 50 miles an hour at night.

His report also said the average speed of commercial vehicles is 48 miles an hour during the day and nearly 50 miles an hour at night, an increase of nearly two miles an hour over last year.

He said the increased average speed may be attributed in part to the recent five-mile-an-hour boost in speed limits on Michigan's expanding freeway network.

**Fewer Deer Hunters Used Highways in Northern Michigan**

Traffic volumes in the northern half of Michigan were down nearly two per cent during the moose deer hunting season compared to the same period last year.

State Highway Commissioner John C. Mackie told the State Safety Commission that, traffic in the eastern end of the Upper Peninsula was down 15 per cent.

Deer hunter traffic in the Houghton Lake and St. Ignace areas showed decreases of two and three per cent, respectively, compared to a year ago.

The largest traffic increases during the deer season were in the Traverse City and Ishpeming areas with respective gains of 15 and 7 per cent.
