District was approved by the Board of Education at its meeting Tuesday night. Recommended by Franklin Whitney, athletic director of Birmingham schools, the program is an attempt to meet the recent demand of parents for a Saturday morning of supervised play. when it comes to choosing their buddies."

THE FATHER'S job-prestige is closely linked to the degree of influence he may wield in his family, which in turn influences his relationship with his son, Dr. Gold continues. His studies contradict the common image of the working class male as "the surly lord of his household" while the middle class male has been eased out of most of the decision-making function, he said.

IN FACT, "the more prestigious the occupation of the father, the more influence he is accorded by members of his family." Evidence shows in addition that "the more influence a man has in his family, the more his son is that he wants to be like his dad when he grows up." These findings, Dr. Gold asserts, "argue strongly that a thoughtful consideration of delinquency or of any aspect of children's behavior or personality development must consider the variable of social class."
