Said bonds for the purchase of 1961 Special Assessment Water Bonds (District No. 40) of the par value of \$1,000.00 will be sold by the undersigned at his office in the City Hall in the City of Troy, State of Michigan, on Monday, the 18th day of January, 1962, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon. Said bonds will be publicly opened and read. Bonds will be coupon bonds of the denominations of \$100.00 each, maturing consecutively in direct order of maturity from 1962 to 1967, and will mature serially: \$2,000—December 1, 1962; \$2,000—December 1, 1963; \$2,000—December 1, 1964; \$2,000—December 1, 1965; \$2,000—December 1, 1966; \$2,000—December 1, 1967.

Said bonds will bear interest from their date at a rate or rates not exceeding five per cent (5%) per annum, in arrears in multiples of 1/4 of 1%. The interest rate shall be subject to redemption, in whole or in part, at the option of the purchaser of the bonds, at any time after the date of delivery of the bonds, and interest will be payable at a bank or trust company to be designated by the purchaser of the bonds, at the time of delivery. Bonds numbered 1 to 21, inclusive, maturing in the years 1962 to 1967, inclusive, shall not be subject to redemption prior to maturity. Bonds numbered 22 to 31, inclusive, maturing in the years 1968 to 1973, inclusive, shall be subject to redemption prior to maturity at the option of the purchaser of the bonds, on any date after the date of delivery of the bonds, and interest accrued thereon shall be paid to the purchaser of the bonds at the time of delivery. Thirty days notice of the call of any bonds for redemption shall be given in a publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the State of Michigan which carries, as part of its regular service notice of sale of municipal bonds. Bonds are called for redemption on the date fixed for redemption, provided funds are on hand with the paying agent to redeem said bonds.

For the purpose of awarding the bonds, the interest cost of each bid will be computed by determining, at the option of the bidder, the total dollar value of all interest on the bonds, as of February 1, 1962, to their maturity, and deducting therefrom the premium. The bonds will be awarded to the bidder whose bid at the above computation produces the lowest interest cost to the City. No proposal for the purchase of less than all of the bonds herein offered, or at a price less than their par value will be considered.

Said bonds are issued in anticipation of the collection of special assessments on the bonds in Special Assessment District No. 40. In addition, said bonds pledge the full faith and credit of the City of Troy for their payment. Each certified or cashier's check in the amount of \$650.00, drawn upon an incorporated bank or trust company, payable to the order of the Treasurer of the City of Troy, must accompany each bid as a guaranty of good faith on the part of the bidder, to be forfeited as liquidated damages if such bid is accepted and the bidder fails to take up and pay on the good faith checks and bonds of returned to each bidder, representative of the City of Troy.

Bids shall be conditional upon the undersigned's approval of the legality of the bonds, which option will be exercised by the undersigned at the time of the award of the bonds prior to the delivery thereof. The undersigned reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

Don't Give A Stain A Chance

The gravy train isn't such a good thing if it's spilled all over your Christmas table. Stain removal can be a problem but there are some jaseas that make stain removal easier and more understandable.

There are three kinds of stains: greasy, non-greasy and a combination of both. Speed is one of the most important elements in removing any stain. The sooner you can try to remove it, the better your chances are of succeeding.

STAINS CAN be set by heat or age, which make them difficult or even impossible to remove. Cool water is the magic ingredient for getting rid of non-greasy stains. Cool water sponging or half-hour soak removes many stains. Some may need an over-night bath. If a stain remains, you can work a detergent into it and follow with a rinse. If it still persists, you may try a bleach. The combination of greasy and non-greasy stains gets the same treatment.

If there is still a greasy spot after you've used a detergent, try a greasy solvent. Let it dry and repeat, if necessary.
