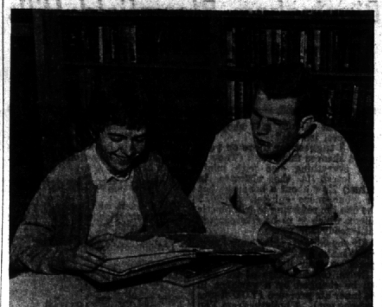

Judge Rules Bid Was in Order For 12-Town Job

Construction of the Twelve Town Drain apparently will start in January without any legal bottlenecks. Oakland Circuit Judge John Beer last week refused to stop a construction contract that was awarded on a corrected bid.

Judge Beer ruled that the original bid of \$1,370,401 by Greenfield Construction Co. for a portion of the Twelve Town work substantially met the specifications. Greenfield had omitted a manhole in its bid and later was allowed to submit a \$2,000 bid to correct it. It was still low bidder after this correction.

THE MOLE Construction Co., runner-up bidder, filed suit against Twelve Town, contending that its bid was the low complete proposal. Mole's attorney is studying the written opinion to determine whether to recommend an appeal.
